ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP) — An Anchorage bartender was fined one cent in magistrate's court for serving liquor to a minor. It was a certainty there never has been a smaller fine imposed in the territory. However, a five-day closure also was ordered against the bar. Magistrate George McLaughlin levied the minimum fine after the 18-year-old girl's own testimony that she forged her baptismal certificate to gain admittance. She was fined \$100.

Rec Program Successful

The 1953 summer recreation program of the Klamath Falls Recreation Dept. is meeting with unprecedented success as far as enthusiastic patronage of the numerous activities is concerned, according to Bob Bonney recreation director.

The organized Pee Wee, Midgets, Juniors, Men's and Women's softball and baseball teams are taxing capacity of facilities; the tennis program is averaging more than 40 persons for daily instruction; the small natatorium is drawing more than 175 swimmers daily. Supervised play on various school grounds is also getting larger than average attendance.

Experience of past years, Bonney said today, has indicated that with the busy Fourth of July week, Roundup activities, family camping and other business that takes residents out of the community—it is impractical to run the organized program during that time. This week, June 29—July 5, the only organized department activities will be supervised at Kiwanis Park with the wading pool operated each afternoon. Tennis instruction will also be continued at Moore Park.

During the lapse in activities, the maintenance crew will have a chance to return facilities and grounds back into tip-top shape. Kiwanis Park, Conger Field and Fairview playground will be thoroughly soaked and fertilized. The Men's Softball Association hopes to complete construction of dugouts at Conger Field during the inactive week.

Registrations for the second session of beginner's swim instruction at the natatorium can be made at the City Hall between now and July 17, or at the natatorium, July 16 through 17.

The Recreation Department reports that an unusual number of phone and written compliments have been received concerning the success of the program. Bonney credits this to the exceptional staff of experienced and qualified people who were attracted to the department this season and to the cooperation of the public.
