## Slugging Lead To Gus Bell

NEW YORK (AP)—A year ago, Gus Bell's future in the major leagues was uncertain. Today, the 24-year-old Cincinnati outfielder is the leading slugger of both circuits.

Slugging averages compiled by the Associated Press show that Bell tops the National League with a .617 mark. He has piled up 156 total bases in 253 times at bat.

In the American League, Al Rosen of the Cleveland Indians shows the top figure of .574. The veteran third baseman has pounded out 12 doubles, two triples and 15 home runs among his 79 hits, for an aggregate of 143 total bases. He has been at bat 249 times. Records include Sunday's games.

Bell, after hitting only .056 in his first seven games with Pittsburgh last year, was optioned to Hollywood of the Pacific Coast League. He was recalled in mid-July and finished with a .350 batting average. The Redlegs acquired him last fall.

This season, Gus really found himself. He has homered in three of his last four games.

Cincinnati first sacker Ted Kluszewski and Eddie Mathews, Milwaukee third baseman, are tied for the runner-up spot behind Bell each with a .506 slugging average.

Gus Zernial of the Philadelphia Athletics is second to Rosen in the American League with .533.

Slugging averages are computed by dividing the number of total bases on all hits by the number of times at bat.

**MATTHEWS RATES 9th**

NEW YORK (AP)—Harry "Kid" Matthews' long campaign to be listed among the heavyweights paid off Tuesday when the Seattle fighter was named No. 9 among the contenders for Rocky Marciano's title in the monthly boxing ratings, compiled by Ring Magazine.

Matthews, on the strength of his recent victory over Freddie Beahere and his claim that he no longer could make the light heavyweight limit comfortably, replaces Heinz Neuhaus in the top 10. The German heavyweight has been inactive, although he soon will meet Karel Sys for the European championship.

By virtue of his close bout with champion Archie Moore, Joey Maxim retains his position as No. 1 contender in the light heavyweight class. England's Randy Turpin and Hawaii's Bobo Olson remain as aspirants for the middleweight throne vacated by Sugar Ray Robinson.

In the lightweight division George Aratulo of Providence, R.I., No. 1 contender last month, was dropped a notch after losing to champion Jimmy Carter. Johnny Gonzales of Oakland, Calif., took over the position of leading contender.
