the seventh highest mountain in the world by reckoning of the National Geographic Society of Washington. It towers over Kashmir, and has defied six earlier attempts at ascent.

Reports reaching New Delhi say the man to reach the top, member of a 10-man team from Germany and Austria, is Hermann Buhl, 26. He is rated Austria's most daring mountain climber, but after World War II earned his living painting church spires and fixing roofs in his native Tyrol.

Nanga Parbat, the "naked lady" of the Himalayas, is the second peak in that mountain range to be scaled this year. In May a New Zealander and an Indian—Sir Ed-

mund Hillary and Tiger Tenzing—surmounted Mt. Everest, 29,000 feet high.

German authorities say Nanga Parbat has claimed the lives of 31 European climbers and porters.

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Sen. Symington Accused Of Violating Congress Rules

WASHINGTON (AP)—Rep. Taber (R-NY) charged today that Sen. Symington (D-Mo) "violated the rules of the House and Senate" by accusing Taber of "bitter and inaccurate attacks" on the Air Force and Gen. Hoyt S. Vandenberg.

Taber said it was a rule that members of the Senate and House "haven't any right to talk about a fellow member of Congress in a derogatory way."

He said, however, he was not surprised at Symington's Senate speech of yesterday—"It's the way the gentleman has always talked."

Symington and other Senate Democrats are in the midst of a fight to put back into the Air Force budget some of the five million dollars the Eisenhower administration chopped out of the original request of former Presi-

dent Truman. Taber, chairman of the House Appropriations Committee, supported a successful move in the House to cut the Air Force budget 240 million dollars below the Eisenhower request.

Symington read a letter he said Taber wrote the editor of the Boston Herald in which Taber said Vandenberg's opposition to the budget cuts was a "ridiculous altitude" to take and amounted to "sabotage" of Secretary of Defense Wilson.

Symington also quoted from the letter that Vandenberg and his "crew" were "trying to cover up their own ineptitudes by making false statements about what the situation is."

Vandenberg, former Air Force chief of staff who retired last week told Congress the Eisenhower Air Force budget would leave this na-

tion with a "second-best" Air Force and that it now is only a "one-shot" Air Force.

Wilson, on the other hand, has promised Congress the new budget would continue to give the nation the best air force in the world.

In his speech yesterday, Symington said the administration program eliminated 200 B47 bombers.



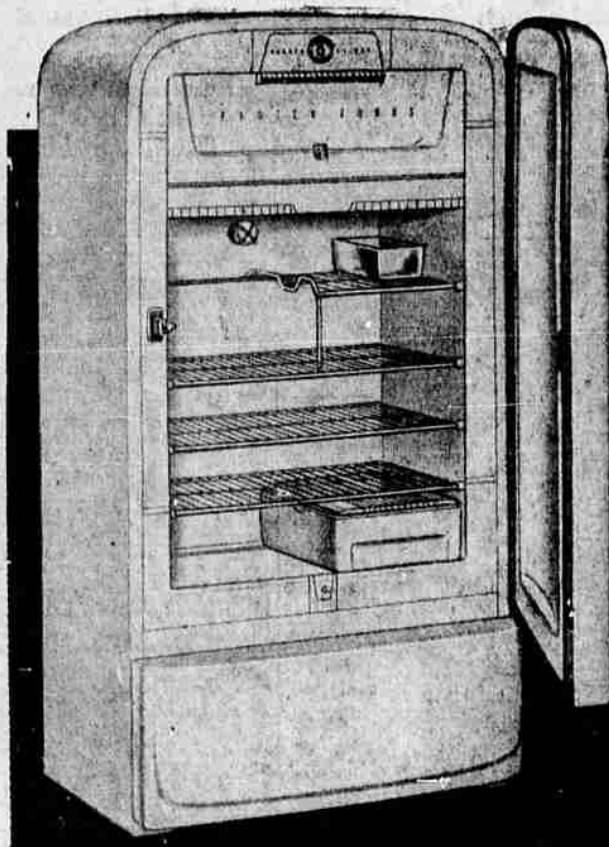
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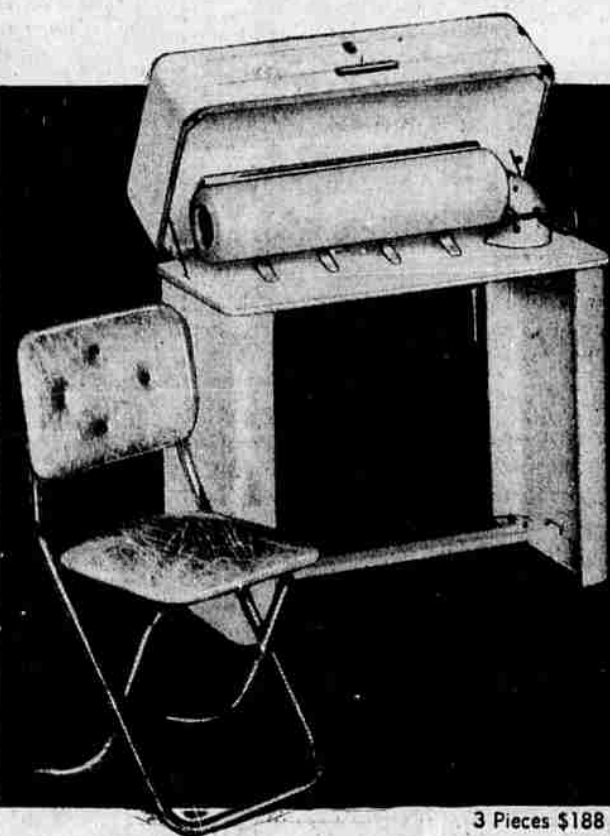
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
