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Four Teams Tie For WIL's Top Position

Competition for second half honors in the Western International Baseball League was shoe-horned tight Wednesday, with four teams knotted in first place and the others bunched closely behind them.

The Yakima Bears and Calgary Stampede turned the race for the top spot into a four-way scramble Tuesday night with victories at Spokane and Victoria.

The Bears nipped Spokane 4-2 and the Stampede edged Victoria 5-3. The wins plus Tri-City's 6-3 triumph over Salem left Salem, Spokane, Yakima and Calgary tied at the head of the standings.

Vancouver downed Edmonton 2-1 to move into a second-place tie with Tri-City, a game back of the leaders, and the Lewiston Broncos and Wenatchee Chiefs shared third place, 2 1/2 games off the pace.

THREE BACK
 Next came Edmonton, three games back, and the Victoria Tyees, who haven't won a game since the second half campaign opened, brought up the rear, five games from the top.

Salem's setback at Kennewick was the second in succession for the first half champion after winning their first five second-half games.

Tri-City scored four runs off Dave Dahl in the first inning and coasted home. Tri-City's Jim Hedgcock spaced eight hits in posting his fourth win against as many losses, while his teammates clubbed Dahl for 16 safeties.

A triple play, the second in a week in the WIL, highlighted the Calgary-Victoria meeting. It came in the seventh inning after Tyee Manager Cece Garriott and Bob Menz had singled. Jim Clark's blow to second forced Garriott; Clark was caught at first and Menz was cut down at home plate.

Persley Favored Tonight

NEW YORK (AP)—Art Persley is a 2-1 favorite to make Cuba's Orlando Zulueta his 13th straight victim at Madison Square Garden tonight.

The odds belle the ratings. The 25-year-old Cuban is ranked fifth in the lightweight division. Persley is 10th.

But Persley is coming and Zulueta may be going. The 29-year-old Red Cross, La., Negro has been waiting a long time for his chance to move and he's finally getting it.

FIRST MAIN
 This is Persley's first main event in the Garden and the 9 p. m. EST, 10-rounder will be telecast coast to coast by CBS. A good showing tonight not only would move the broad-shouldered Persley higher in the rankings but also could put him in line for a title shot with Champion Jimmy Carter.

His 12 wins in a row makes the hustling Persley the most consistent fighter among the top 135-pounders.

In his last showing, a 10-rounder with Percy Bassett on May 18, Persley easily outclassed the former featherweight champion. That victory propelled him into the rankings for the first time.

GOOD RECORD
 His record in the book is 39-2-2. He hasn't been beaten since Luther Rawlings flattened him in three rounds June 8, 1951.

Zulueta's record is 43-18-9. In four fights this year he stopped Rawlings in five split two decisions with Wallace (Bud) Smith and drew with Joey Brown. The slender Cuban has a fast left, a good right, and takes a good punch.

Seven foot, 1 inch Gary Nelson, who broke two Washington State Class A high school tournament records last spring, reported Tuesday he had registered for fall classes at the University of Washington.

He had announced earlier he favored Oregon, but said he changed his mind because Washington is "closer to home" and he considered Tippy Dye an "outstanding coach."

In his final year at Elma High School the elongated center racked up 824 points in 26 games, and set a new Class A tournament record of 40 points for a single game and 119 for four.
