Job Protected By McCarthy

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis) held a first round victory Wednesday over a majority of his Senate investigations subcommittee seeking to oust J. B. Matthews as subcommittee staff chief.

Matthews, in a recent American Mercury magazine article, wrote that 7,000 Protestant clergymen constitute "the largest single group supporting the Communist apparatus" in the U. S.

Three Democrats and a Republican on the seven-man subcommittee are demanding his removal from the \$11,646-a-year committee job. They declared Wednesday their fight is far from ended, and that they still consider the article "shocking."
