

# Un-American Committee Says 'Several' Red Clergy Named

NEW YORK (AP)—The House Un-American Activities Committee today named several American clergymen as members of the Communist party.

The witnesses were said to have given the group "information of extreme importance" about Communist infiltration of the clergy.

Rep. Kit Clardy (R-Mich.), acting chairman at two days of New York hearings, announced the testimony yesterday. He emphasized the committee was not probing clergy or churches but was trying to expose Reds "whether in the clergy... or any other group."

The probe is being pursued here today with Rep. Gordon H. Scherer (R-Mich.) sitting as a subcommittee of one to hear two witnesses. Full committee sessions were adjourned.

Clardy did not identify those named in the testimony, nor did

he say how many persons were involved. He said the information would be checked and—if verified—made public in accord with a committee policy "to forestall all possibility of smearing and defaming innocent American citizens."

A prepared statement by the committee said it had received testimony on how Communists planned to and did infiltrate the ranks of clergy "in the United States."

Witnesses giving the information were identified by Clardy as Benjamin Gitlow and Joseph Kornfeder, who was said to have been an "important Communist party functionary" and intimate of the late Soviet Premier.

Gitlow was described as a charter member of the American Communist party who broke with the Reds. Kornfeder and Gitlow testified at closed sessions yesterday.

The committee statement said that in a closed hearing Monday night it received "illuminating testimony" on Communists among the clergy from Col. Archibald Roosevelt son of the late President Theodore Roosevelt.

Clardy said Roosevelt's testimony would be made public as soon as it is transcribed.

Asked by a reporter for a Communist newspaper whether he would attack a clergyman found to be a Communist, Clardy answered: "I would not attack him. I would expose him."

The committee said two other

witnesses testifying at a closed session yesterday were John E. Marqusee, 23-year-old Cornell University law student described as a former Communist, and Vladimir Petrov, identified as an anti-Red Russian once imprisoned in a Soviet concentration camp.

Scherer said Marqusee testified that the Communist party had a definite pattern for the infiltration of clergy and other groups in all

non-Communist countries. Clardy said Petrov shocked the committee with "an appalling story of how the Communists seek to exterminate all religion... a story of murder and brutality almost beyond belief."
