Russian Minister Of Heavy Industry, Transport Relieved

MOSCOW (AP)—Vyacheslav A. Malyshev, one of the Soviet Union's top engineers and planners, has been relieved of his post as minister of transport and heavy industry in another major government change.

The announcement that Malyshev has been replaced by Ivan Isidorovich Nosenko was made in the newspaper Evening Moscow. The newspaper listed Nosenko as the new boss of the key ministry in an account of a meeting at which it said Nosenko spoke out sharply against the purged deputy premier, Lavrenty P. Beria.

Malyshev, a former deputy premier, was considered by Western authorities to be one of the most important men in the Soviet Union.

Sen. Holmes Mum On Race

PORTLAND (AP)—State Sen. Robert D. Holmes, Gearhart Democrat, said Monday it is too early to tell whether he might become a candidate for governor next year.

"It's too early, I felt Newbury's (Secretary of State Earl Newbury) announcement for the job was early—premature—and everybody I talk to feels the same way. He forced Paul (Gov. Paul Patterson) into a position.... He puts the board of control into a mess. It is almost impossible for the board of control to do anything now without it seeming one is pitted against the other. I don't think it is fair to the people," Holmes said.

Newbury has announced his candidacy for governor. Patterson has not.

'Brain' To Enter Medical School

BALTIMORE (AP)—The "brain" is coming to Johns Hopkins Medical School.

Frank Milligan, 21, of Victoria, B. C., will start studies here in September.

He was graduated summa cum laude from Portland (Ore.) University this year with a 3.99 average, the highest mark ever attained there in a four-year course. Perfection is 4.00.

Milligan compiled 47 A's and one B—in freshman physical education. The "low" mark resulted when he failed a swimming test.

700 Rotten Eggs Leave Road Joyless

JACKSON, Mich. (AP)—A small road north of Jackson is an unpopular spot these hot days.

During the weekend, someone dumped about 700 dozen rotten eggs in piles along the road.

Deputy Sheriff Blair Corley, who followed his nose to the source of the trouble, said some of the eggs were in cases dated November 1952. He theorized that the eggs were hijacked and spoiled before the thieves could find a market for them.
