Cole Porter Says You Have To Get Used To His Songs

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—The trouble with my songs is that you have to get used to them.

This is Cole Porter talking. He is one of the Big Five of modern American music. The others: Jerome Kern, George Gershwin, Irving Berlin, Richard Rodgers. These men have generally been caressed by the critics while Porter takes a beating.

"I just get burned at the critics," said the sophisticate from Peru, Ind. "Every time I write songs for a show, they say, 'The music is not up to Mr. Porter's standard.'"

"One time my wife and I got so peeved that we decided to find out what my 'standard' was. She keeps vast books of clippings and we went back to my first Broadway show, which I did with a friend of mine from Harvard. The critics then said, 'These boys should leave New York and never come back!'"

The composer added that his clash with the critics is due to the nature of his songs.

"It would be different if I wrote songs like Irving Berlin," he observed. "People love Irving's songs the minute they hear them. They also love them 20 years later. But my songs have to grow on you."

Some of Porter's greatest hits have been slow builders. Like "Night and Day," which Fred Astaire introduced in "The Gay Divorcee."

"My wife and I left for Europe after the show opened and we were very disappointed that no one seemed to like the song," he recalled. "Fred was the only one who recorded the song at the outset."

Then there was "Begin the Beguine," I wrote it for a show called "Jubilee" and nothing happened with it. The only critic who mentioned it was Robert Benchley, who said, "Why throw in just another rumba?" Five years later, Artie Shaw recorded the song and made it a hit.

"Years later, Benchley used to hang out in a club on the Sunset Strip. Whenever I would walk in, the band would play 'Begin the Beguine.' Bob would hide his face behind a napkin and say, 'I know, I know.'"

Porter is now resting between engagements at his French chateau-like home in Brentwood. (He even flies the Tricolor beside the swimming pool.) Although slowed down physically by his legs, both broken in a horse fall several years ago, he keeps up a hot creative pace.

Having put "Can Can" on Broadway, he returned here to oversee the film version of "Miss Minkie Kate," with which he is very happy. He is starting work on another Broadway show, which will be announced soon. He has turned out scores for plays and pictures with regularity since the first World War. Does he ever worry about running out of ideas?

"No," he replied flatly. "I just hope that my mind will stay alert enough to keep working."

He admitted that shows are harder to compose these days and he good-naturedly blames that on Rodgers and Hammerstein.

"It was easier to turn out tunes in the old days," he sighed. "But

then Rodgers and Hammerstein began writing great shows in which the songs were related to the plot. Now you can't just write a song and throw it into the show in any spot."

His favorite song? "I guess it's 'Love for Sale.' I like it best because it's kind of a stepchild, being banned from the radio and so forth. I can't under-

stand it. You can write a novel about a harlot, paint a picture of a harlot, but you can't write a song about a harlot."

Shasta To Change Rule For Boaters

The charging for boat launching and vehicle parking will be permitted at Bridge Bay Resort effective immediately. It was announced today by Robert E. Jones, Supervisor of the Shasta National Forest.

Supervisor Jones points out that the Forest Service has now provided a new boat launching area free to the public which replaces that formerly available to them at Bridge Bay. The new area is at Bailey Cove about 4 miles north on Highway 99. The new facilities at Bailey Cove were made available last year by the construction of a one mile long road and the grading of a parking area. Other free boat launching areas available to the public are at Centimud Creek near Shasta Dam, Salt Creek Inlet, Antlers, Lakeshore, Sugarloaf and Jones Valley.

The use of the limited space at Bridge Bay both for the development of a resort and for free public boat launching and parking has created a serious overcrowded condition which will prevent the full development for resort purposes. Rapid expansion of the Bridge Bay Resort has reached the stage where full use of the available area is necessary to continue this development.

The problem of overcrowding at Bridge Bay has been the subject of considerable concern over the past year. After review of conditions and the other free facilities available to the public, the Shasta Lake Advisory Council has unanimously recommended to the Forest Service that the Bridge Bay Resort be allowed to charge for boat launching and parking services. The Advisory Council was of the opinion that this action was necessary so that parking could be supervised by attendants and full development of the area could proceed.

The cooperation of the public is requested in the use of the free boat launching areas to see that the cars and boat trailers are parked properly. This would permit all to have unobstructed access to the Lake to launch their boats.

Supervisor Jones further states that the full program of development of Shasta Lake as a recreation area includes the expansion of boat launching facilities so that these areas will be conveniently located close to the popular boating areas of the lake. The improvement of existing facilities and construction of new areas under this program will proceed as rapidly as funds are available.
