Can-Makers Move East

Ever wonder how long it takes to make a year's supply of tin cans for the average Oregon family?

Less than 20 minutes, according to A. T. Augensen, Pacific manager of manufacturers for the American Can Company, who reports that an average of 788 cans of products of all types are opened annually by every family in the state.

High-speed automatic machines at a Portland factory now produce these containers at speeds up to 450 per minute. In the past century, the firm's representatives which engineered modern methods of container making, said, one man required more than 12 days to hand-make the same number of cans.

More than one-third of all the cans opened in typical American homes contain fruits and vegetables. Next come beer cans, followed by cans for evaporated milk, oil and coffee.

Fleeting Glimpse New Way

Ivy Baker Priest, the new Treasurer of the United States, began work as a telephone operator when she was forced by the illness of her father to leave college.

Today she can look back on a political and public service career that dates back to 1932.

She first became interested in politics through the Young Republicans. In 1934 she became president of the Utah State Young Republicans and two years later she served as western regional director of the Young Republican National Federation for a period of four years. During the war years of 1940 to 1944, she was a member of the Utah State Republican Committee.

In 1944 she became a member of the Republican National Committee for Utah. Her political career began reaching a climax in 1952 when she became assistant to the chairman of the National GOP Committee and head of the Women's Division during the hectic campaign days. It was then her political experience paid off in a successful fight to turn a decisive women's vote for the Eisenhower-Nixon ticket.

Shortly after the presidential elections, President Eisenhower appointed her Treasurer of the United States and she assumed office on Jan. 28, 1953.

Always interested in public service, tall, slim Ivy Priest has been keenly concerned with the problems of the West. She became recognized as a leader in a movement to establish a minimum wage for working women in Utah and for her role in creating a Youth Center for Davis County.

She served, too, as president of the Utah State Women's Legislative Council, as vice president of the Utah Safety Council and in

the American Red Cross and the General Federation of Women's Clubs.

Soon after she first went to work, she went into the merchandising field and, at the same time, taught night classes in American history and citizenship.

Recipe

MACARONI SURPRISE

1/2 cup uncooked elbow macaroni
4 slices bacon
1/2 pound liver, cubed
2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup sliced sweet onion
1 can (10 ounces) mushroom soup
1 1/2 tablespoons steak sauce
1 cup whole kernel corn
Cook macaroni according to directions on package. Drain and rinse. While macaroni is cooking, fry bacon in skillet until lightly brown. Roll liver in flour which has been seasoned with salt. Brown liver in skillet. Add onions and cook until onions are slightly tender. Pour soup into a mixing bowl, add steak sauce and stir until well blended. Fold in the macaroni, liver, onions and corn. Pour into greased casserole and top with bacon strips. Place in refrigerator. Bake in 400 degree oven for 30 minutes.

UPSIDE DOWN CAKE

All measurements are level. Sift flour before measuring. Have all ingredients at room temperature (about 70°). Preheat oven to baking temperature, 350°, a moderate oven. Place over moderate heat in bottom of a deep 8-inch upside down cake pan or skillet—

1/2 cup butter or margarine

1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed, free from lumps)

Stir frequently until sugar is melted and mixture is bubbly. Remove from heat and arrange over mixture—

6 apricot halves, fresh or canned

3 slices canned pineapple

maraschino cherries

walnut or pecan halves

Set aside in warm place while preparing cake batter. Beat until stiff—

3 egg whites

Beat in gradually—

1 cup sugar

Add—

2 egg yolks, well beaten

1 teaspoon vanilla

Sift together—

1 cup sifted Sperry Drifted Snow

1 teaspoon double-action baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

Fold carefully into egg mixture alternately with—

1/2 cup hot water or pineapple juice
