BRISTOL, Va., (AP)—An official of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis met with local physicians today to decide on emergency measures in an effort to check Virginia's worst polio outbreak of the year.

The National Foundation representative, G. Ford McGinness of Washington, arrived here last night as reports were received of four new cases to run the two-week total to 28 within a 6-mile radius of this Virginia-Tennessee border city. Two of the victims have died.
