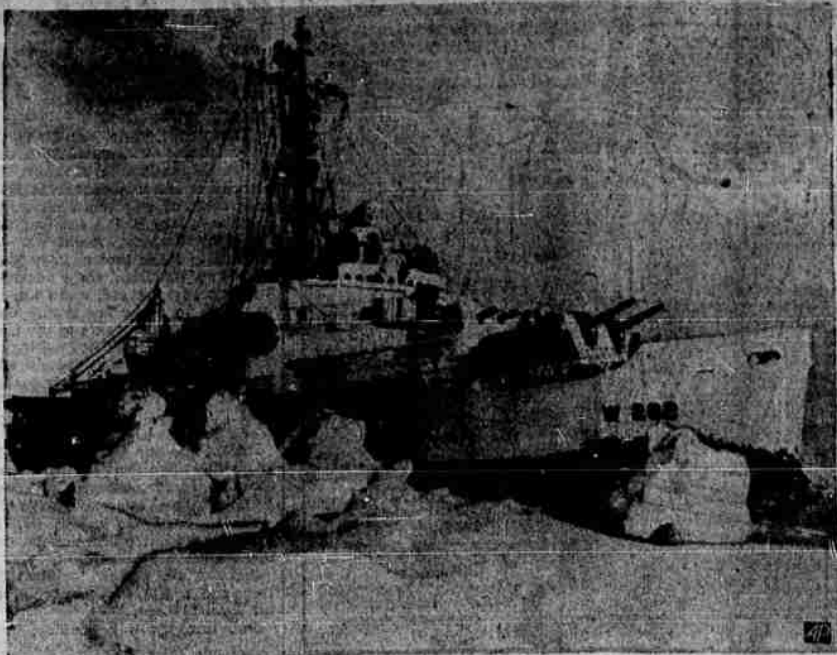

Compromise Bill Reached

WASHINGTON (AP)—A \$5,253,177, 60¢ money bill, a compromise between different versions passed earlier by the Senate and House, was okayed by both branches yesterday and sent to the White House. It carries funds to operate, during the fiscal year which started July 1, the Atomic Energy Commission, the Tennessee Valley Authority and selective service.

Judge Sees Therapeutic Value to Pen

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Federal District Judge John W. Murphy has his own ideas about a jail's therapeutic values.

An attorney for Maurice Rose, convicted of lying before a special grand jury investigating the operation of GI training schools, told Murphy yesterday that a prison sentence would affect Rose's health adversely. Rose, he said, has diabetes.

"The last diabetic I sent to prison improved considerably while he was confined," the judge commented. He sentenced Rose to two years in a federal penitentiary.

Trucker Struck By Train He Missed

WARWICK, Va. (AP)—Willie E. Smith, 36, of Richmond, was driving his truck on State Route 168 near here during a rainstorm yesterday. Too late, he saw the red caution lights blinking at a railroad crossing.

He slammed on the brakes. The truck started skidding. It skidded all the way across the tracks, clear of the approaching train, and Smith was about to breathe a sigh of relief when the vehicle suddenly did a U-turn and skidded right back on the tracks.

The train slammed into the truck. Smith walked away unhurt but the truck was destroyed.

Town Marshal Held In Stray Dog Bludgeoning

DEFUNIAK SPRINGS, Fla. (AP)—Sheriff Aubrey McDonald of Walton County said the town marshal here was arrested last night after four teen-age boys testified he paid them 25 cents to kill a homeless dog.

The sheriff said the marshal, John Donaldson, and the four youths were arrested on charges of cruelty to an animal. All five were released in bonds of \$100 each.

The youths testified in affidavits, the sheriff said, that the marshal offered one of them 25 cents to kill the stray dog, a part-shepherd female, and that the other three boys were asked by the youth to help him.

The statements said the dog was bludgeoned with an iron pipe.

Red Technicians Reported Slain

TAIPEH, Formosa (AP)—The English-language China News reported today two Russians, "presumably radar technicians slain in last week's Nationalist commando raid on Red-held Tungshan Island off south China. The Defense Ministry said there was as yet no confirmation.
