

## Examiners For Dropping Suit

WASHINGTON (AP) — Two Interstate Commerce Commission examiners Wednesday recommended dismissal of government claims against the railroads for about two billion dollars for alleged overcharges on wartime freight shipment.

The examiners, Howard Hosmer

and Marion L. Boat, said the charges paid by the government were, on the whole, considerably lower than they would have been for commercial shippers.

All told, the government filed 17 complaints against the railroads between June 1946 and October 1948.

The complaints, filed by the attorney general, alleged the railroads raised rates and charges for the transportation of carloads of government freight during World War II, as well as before, were "unjust and unreasonable."

The examiners disagreed with this. They recommended to the commission that it dismiss the complaints on the ground the charges have not been shown to be unreasonable.

The ICC said the Justice Department or any one who might want to object will be given until Sept. 21 to file papers. Another month will be given for replies to objections.
