Strategic Hill Under Dispute

SEOUL (AP)—South Korean infantrymen fought with bayonets, knives and rifle butts to the top of strategic Sam Hyon Hill in central Korea today, but were beaten off in a savage five-hour fight with a reinforced Chinese regiment.

North of Sam Hyon, Allied air and ground observers reported sighting Chinese troops. Allied big guns shelled two separate Red battalions massing north of the battle line, plus a concentration of about 40 Red trucks and six tanks.

Rugged Sam Hyon Hill overlooks important territory on the Kumsong Bulge line, which the South Koreans established after being forced back last week by the mightiest Red offensive in two years.

Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor, commander of the U. S. 8th Army, toured the critical Central Front with South Korean President Syngman Rhee. He told commanders of the two Allied forces holding the Kumsong line—the U. S. 8th Corps and ROK 2nd Corps—the mighty Red offensive has been repulsed and the Allies now occupy "the shortest and most defensible line consistent with their mission in this area."

Clinging doggedly to the southern slopes of Sam Hyon, the ROKs fought through this afternoon with Chinese on the north, the 8th Army reported. The South Koreans had jumped off at 7 a. m., and suggested their way to the summit in close combat by 10. They were hurled back around 12:30 p. m. by a regiment of 3,500 attacking Chinese.

8-Registrant Survey Shows Heroin is Best

CHICAGO (AP)—The first eight narcotics addicts to register in Chicago under a recently enacted state law show a decided preference for heroin.

Edward O. Holly, assistant director of the State Department of Health and Registration, said yesterday seven of the registrants use heroin while one is a marijuana smoker.

The law is designed to discourage illegal use of drugs by requiring addicts to register and carry registration certificates or face jail sentences of up to one year.

A Robin Hood Gets Probation

DETROIT (AP)—A modern Robin Hood was on probation today. Joseph A. Clark, 45, pleaded guilty in recorder's court to stealing 23 pairs of shoes and distributing them to needy friends.

Judge Gerald W. Grant ordered him to repay the Regal Shoe Co. \$228.75 and fined him \$50.

FUN ON THE FORCE

ALBUQUERQUE (AP)—Police Sgt. A. I. Neete is on a diet, so when his birthday rolled around this week members of the force presented him with a cake—made of onions, cabbage and carrots.

Only reason Neete could figure out was that they were getting back for the corsages he passed out last Christmas—made of chili peppers.

Most braces are made for American servicemen and veterans. But many have been sent to their dependents. Nordstrom and Shaw have worked on splits and supports for a 10-day-old baby and a 74-year-old grandmother.

Although some braces can be made in half an hour, the two specialists spent 2½ weeks making a complex body-length job of steel, leather and cloth that will restore motion to a man left helpless from the neck down by a polio attack.

Nordstrom has been credited with designing and building a unique brace used in treating palsy of the hand. It straightens out the hand while allowing for the exercise that may mean eventual cure.

He is a veteran of 11 years as an Army and Air Force medic. Nine of those years he spent in orthopedic work. And in January, 1952, he opened the Wright-Patterson brace shop. The only other Air Force shop of its kind is located in Texas' Lackland Air Force Base.

Nordstrom's skill has been used by the Army, too. In 1940 he was sent to the Philippines to train natives in the manufacture of artificial limbs.

In the military service, which has a category for everything and everything in a category, no one has thought of a name for Nordstrom's specialty.

No one has yet built a pigeon-hole for this man, who needs for his job an understanding of anatomy, welding, and sheet-metal work while he doubles as a pattern-maker and a seamstress.
