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First Presbyterian Church Has History of 73 Years

The history of the First Presbyterian Church of Klamath Falls goes back to the first organized Sunday School in Linkville. This was organized in 1886 by William A. Wright as Superintendent, before this there had been sporadic Sunday Schools held but no continuous organization. Meetings were moved to establish a Presbyterian Church.
The church was organized February 27, 1884, with six charter members: R. T. Baldwin, his daughter Mrs. Harriet Roberts, William A. Wright and his wife Jennie, Wright, Mrs. Lucy McClean, wife of Rev. McClean, and Mercedes Campora; Mrs. Rebecca the opening. This bell was removed to the new church and is still being heard every Sunday.
We can hardly imagine a picture of Linkville in the early days of this church. It consisted of a number of business buildings and residences clustered near the river, then scattering houses and other stated supplies. Several of these men were given a call as pastor but none accepted; the first regularly installed pastor being Rev. W. H. Dierdorff.
PASTORS
The exact dates for early pastors is lost till 1888. The following list shows the men who have served the church and the dates:
Rev. S. Sayre, 1888; Rev. Robert McClean, 1888; Rev. Eneas McClean, 1888; Rev. Joseph Hamilton, 1888-89; Rev. A. F. Lott, 1889-90; Rev. J. H. Cronwall, 1892; Rev. J. F. Edmunds, 1893; Rev. A. J. Goodfriend, 1893-94; Rev. C. Cox, 1895-96; Rev. W. H. Dierdorff, 1897-1900; Rev. J. M. McComb, 1901-02; Rev. W. F. Shields, 1902-03; Rev. W. T. Elsen, 1903-07; Rev. W. G. Smith, 1903-07; Rev. George T. Pratt, 1907-11; Rev. J. S. Stubblefield, 1911-15; Rev. C. T. Hurd, 1915-17; Rev. E. P. Lawrence, 1917-21; Rev. Arthur L. Rice, 1921-26; Rev. D. V. Haight, 1926-30; Rev. A. Theodore Smith, 1930-44; Rev. David F. Barnett Jr., 1944.
It will be noted that in the earlier history very few stayed over a year and several not even a year. When ministers began to stay longer the progress of the church also improved and since 1903 our record is much better than the first nineteen years.
It is rather interesting to note that four went from here to Merford, viz.: Eneas McClean, J. F. Edmunds, W. F. Shields and E. P. Lawrence.
ISRAELITE
One minister, A. J. Goodfriend, was a converted Jew of the tribe of Levi (the ancient priestly tribe of Israel). He could trace his ancestry back over 1000 years.
In 1909 under George T. Pratt work towards a new church building was started. These plans were abandoned because the ditch in front of the church property could not be filled. Finally under E. P. Lawrence the old church property, at 3rd and Pine was sold, the present site at 6th and Pine bought and the cornerstone of the present building laid in 1919.
Men were scarce among the early members of the church so for many years William A. Wright was the only elder, was leader of the

Bouton and Mr. A. F. Bouton joined in a short time and are often considered as Charter members.
VISITORS
Shortly after the church was organized it was visited by J. Bayard Henry, Presbyterian layman of Philadelphia and nephew of Secretary of State Bayard of President Cleveland's Cabinet. Henry was impressed by the possibilities and future of this town and offered to give one half of the amount needed to erect a church building. The rest was raised by subscription in the town with a few outside donations, the largest of which came from H. W. Corbett and U. S. Ladd of Portland.
The church was dedicated in 1885 and became the center not only of the religious life of the community but also the center of much of the civic, social and educational activities. Here were held school and other entertainments. The first school commencement exercises ever held in Klamath County were held in this church as well as those for several subsequent years. Even after denominations organized here the Sunday School continued the only Sunday School in town for many years. Preachers from many other denominations were granted the use of the church on many occasions and during the times when the church had no pastor some of the other churches held regular services in the edifice.
One of the highlights in the early history was acquiring the church bell; this being the first large bell in Klamath County. There was much disappointment though, the first Sunday the bell arrived, for it was found no place had been provided for getting the bell into the steeple. By another week this problem was solved by cutting a hole in the ceiling of the vestibule and proceeding to lift the bell through

buildings up Main Street, ending at the schoolhouse on the hill at 9th Street. Beyond this lay a tract of sagebrush and then the Brooks ranch of some 1,500 acres this also extended along Klamath Avenue to about 1st Street. There were three or four saloons under no regulation at all, the streets were not even graded and only a few scattering sections of sidewalk gave opportunity to scrape off the sticky mud. Antelope ranged the valley between the hills, mule deer wandered just beyond the Brooks ranch, cougar and bear were in the adjacent hills, Link River teemed with trout and salmon and was a favorite duck hunting ground in the winter. In the spring for two weeks or more wild geese filled the sky on their migration with flocks visible at any time during the day and audible all through the night. Prairie chickens sat on the fences near the present City Hall, sage hen were common all over the sagebrush; the musical notes of the sand hill crane and swan often resounded through the air while the whistle of the brown curlew was common in the meadows.
The early history of the church shows a rapidly shifting line of

As the membership increased the Session was brought up to three by the election of Frank H. McCornack and W. C. Lincoln. This continued for a few years until Mr. Lincoln moved away and Mr. Wright resigned leaving Mr. McCornack the only elder.
Early additions to the church included Mrs. E. F. Heldrich, mother of Mrs. Marion Hanks; Mrs. Lizzie Shallock, mother of the late Mrs. J. F. Daggett; Mrs. E. Wise, mother of Frank Ward; Mrs. Sears and her daughter Mrs. Cora; well; Katie Wright, now Mrs. White; Frank McCornack, Mrs. Frank McCornack, L. A. L. wis and family, W. C. Lincoln and family, Mrs. Amelia Hanks, C. W. Gordon, Mrs. W. E. Moore and Mr. and Mrs. A. D. Carrick.
