Idaho Power Sees Greater Fun Value to its Three Dams

WASHINGTON (AP)—Idaho Power Co. contends the recreation value of the three Snake River dams it hopes to build would exceed that of a proposed federal Hells Canyon Dam.

Idaho Power Vice President Ralph M. Gale testified Friday at a Power Commission hearing on the firm's applications to build dams along the Idaho-Oregon border. He said water levels in the three reservoirs would rise and fall only a few feet.

This would make the reservoir areas desirable as sites for parks, picnic ground and campsites and it would open a 90-mile river stretch to boating, he added.

Admiral Urges Sea Control

QUANTICO MARINE BASE, Va. (AP)—Adm. Robert B. Carney, Navy operations chief designate, told a military conference here Saturday the United States must retain control of the seas in any war with Russia because if that was lost the war would be lost.

He referred particularly to the menace of the growing Soviet submarine fleet. Gen. Nathan Twining, air chief of staff, emphasized that both the United States and Russia are more vulnerable to air attack than any other form of direct attack.

President Eisenhower, who arrived at Quantico Friday afternoon for the military discussions, sat beside Defense Secretary Charles E. Wilson throughout Saturday morning's session, but took no part in it, a spokesman said.

Wilson told the 120 civilian and military officials of his office and the armed forces that he believes the conference he called is an outstanding success and hoped to hold similar ones in the future.

Kerns Tells Of DP Work

Ben Kerns, Klamath Falls man now with the J. W. Kerns firm spoke at the Rotary Club Friday noon at the Willard Hotel on his experiences in Europe working with the displaced persons program.

Kerns spent a year in Europe with the United Nations and four years there with the United States DP commission. He pointed out that Congress again is considering legislation to allow entry into the United States of 300,000 refugees.

He said that there were 12 steps taken in documentation of the entire lives of those wishing to enter the U. S. which took eight to 12 months, followed by investigation by security agencies.

West Germany has a very great number of displaced persons from the former German East Prussia, from East Germany, and from the other countries behind the Iron Curtain, he said, adding:

The recent rioting in East Berlin is heartening in that it shows that those people still have the will, in the face of death, to stand up against totalitarianism.
