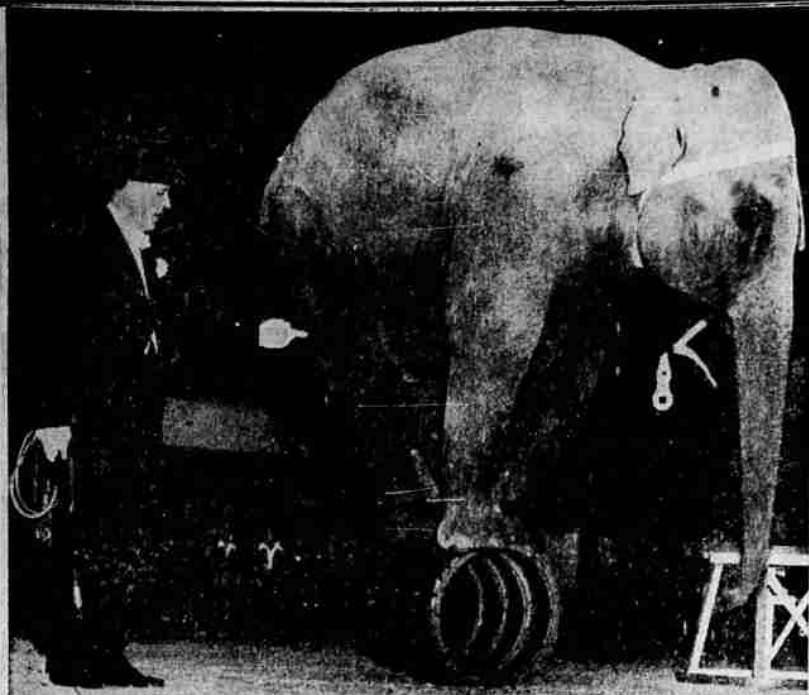

Clark Denies Truce Violations

TOKYO (AP) — Gen. Mark Clark, U. N. and Far East commander, left today for the United States. As he boarded a plane he told newsmen, "We haven't violated the armistice as far as I know."

The Communists today said the Allies have violated terms of the armistice on eight occasions. The general and Mrs. Clark will visit a daughter in San Francisco and attend the wedding of their son in New Orleans Aug. 3.

Clark will go to Washington afterward for top-level conferences.

Benefit Hike Message Seen

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower was reported today to be planning a message to Congress this week urging an increase in social security benefits and greatly expanded coverage.

The President generally had been expected to seek coverage for more persons but the proposal to liberalize methods of determining benefits would come as a surprise.

Sources close to the situation, who asked not to be identified, said the proposals would be intended for congressional action next year—not in the closing days of the current session.

They said the President's plan, his first step in carrying out a campaign pledge to improve social security, would have these two main points:

1. Adding more than 10 million persons to the present total of more than 60 million covered by the old age and survivors' insurance program.

2. A new provision for determining benefits, permitting workers to deduct their four years of lowest pay in determining their average annual income under the system. Benefits are based on this average.

Truman Seeks Way To Ease Tax Bite On Memoirs Sale

NEW YORK (AP) — Judge Samuel I. Rosenman said Tuesday discussions are underway with the Internal Revenue Bureau to permit former President Truman to ease the tax bite on the magazine sale of his memoirs to Time, Inc.

Rosenman would not confirm that Truman will get \$600,000 for the sale, but said a report that the tax plan had been turned down was "incorrect." A spokesman for the revenue service said in Washington there had been no ruling on the tax plan.

Rosenman said the Internal Revenue Bureau suggested some technical revisions in the plan which is

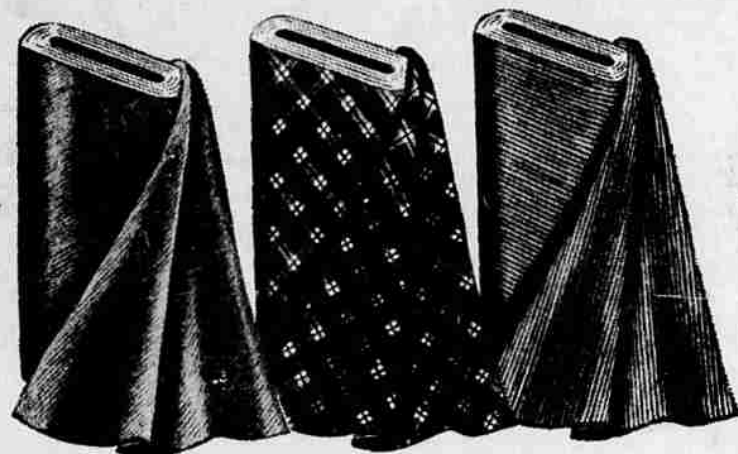
"This is a routine thing, many authors have done this," said Rosenman, former White House aide, who is handling legal details of the Truman memoirs.

The Chicago Tribune Tuesday gave the \$600,000 figure for the memoirs sale and said the government had refused to allow Truman

to spread his tax payments over seven income years.

It said Charles D. Davis, former chief counsel of the Revenue Bureau who resigned in June, had refused to approve the agreement between Truman and Time, Inc., which is publishing the memoirs serially in Life Magazine.

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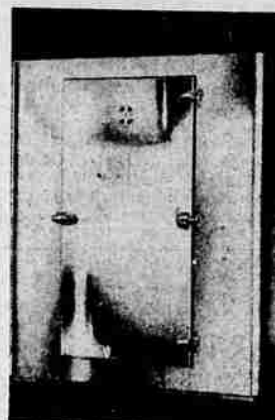


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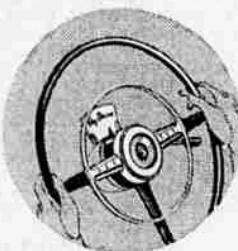
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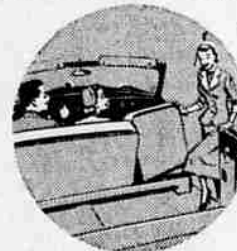
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
