Church Puts Coordinator In Office

Appointment of Richard H. Chase of Providence, Rhode Island, former Army combat chaplain, to coordinate the relations of the Christian Science church with the armed services and the Veterans Administration, was announced Monday by Mrs. Lois Erickson, Assistant Committee on Publication.

Chase has been named Manager of Christian Science Activities for the Armed Services. The appointment was made by the Christian Science Board of Directors of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston.

His duties will include procurement of chaplains and civilian religious ministers at military installations and veterans hospitals, and liaison with the chaplains and supervision of the ministers furnished by The Mother Church for service throughout the United States and overseas. His office will be in Boston, headquarters of the denomination, but he will be in constant touch with officials at the Pentagon and elsewhere in Washington.

Men and women who serve at these installations as Christian Science practitioners will henceforth be known as Christian Science Ministers for the Armed Services. Previously they were known as Christian Science War-time Ministers during World War II, and as Christian Science Workers since then.

Men and women in the armed services formerly known as Christian Science Volunteer Workers are now known as Christian Science Representatives in the Armed Services.

One of the Army's most decorated chaplains during World War II, Mr. Chase holds the Croix de Guerre, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star with one cluster, and the European Theater of Operations ribbon with seven battle stars. He landed with the first assault troops on North Africa, Sicily, and Normandy, and remained with the troops through France, Belgium, and Germany.

Last Funnymen Predict Return To Noble 2-Reelers

 HOLLYWOOD (AP)—The last of the short-subject comedians today predicted a return to the brief comedies that used to be on every movie program.

The sole remaining practitioners of a noble craft—the one-reel and two-reel comedies—are those veteran knockabouts, the Three Stooges. They are still playing the field that gave stardom to such names as Charlie Chaplin, Harold Lloyd, Buster Keaton, W. C. Fields, Fatty Arbuckle, Laurel and Hardy and other greats.

Since the deaths of Edgar Kennedy and Leon Errol, the Stooges are the only comics left in shorts series. They are doing mighty well, thank you. They are now celebrating their 20th year in shorts by making some 3D subjects. Man, think of the possibilities—ples coming right at the audience!

"Comedy shorts are coming back," observed Moe Howard, the guy in the middle who deals out the knocks to the other two. "They've got to. The studios are going in for big productions. That means they'll have to round out the theater program with a news, cartoon and comedy."

"And since so many of the big pictures are dramas, that means they'll need some comedy relief to balance the bill."

The Stooges' comedy is a relief to everyone but themselves. They'd take a terrific beating. Although Moe generally bops his partners, he is the one who usually gets hurt in the filming. Since he plays the bul-

ly, he generally gets his just deserts in some violent manner. "I cracked up three of my ribs in one scene," said Moe, grimacing at the thought. "Another time I nearly broke my foot. I was nearly blinded three times—once with lampblack, once with granite dust and another time with mud."

"Yeah, but what about that time at the Hippodrome when you nearly broke my nose," interjected Larry Fine, the high-domed character. "I couldn't take a bow because my nose was bleeding so."

The two reminisced about old injuries. Joining in was the third member of the trio, Shemp Howard, a man with a monumentally homely face. He lets the other two

Dairy Leaders Claim Poor Pushing Done

WASHINGTON (AP)—Dairy industry leaders today blamed "a miserable" job of salesmanship for a surplus of butter, cheese and dried milk piling up in government hands.

To correct this situation, the American Dairy Association is developing a 10 million dollar year sales promotion and advertising campaign to get consumers to buy more milk and dairy foods.

Plans for such a campaign were disclosed yesterday by officials of the association and the National Milk Producers Federation following a conference with President Eisenhower and Secretary of Agriculture Benson at the White House.

Clergymen Arrested For Guiding Plane

HONG KONG (AP)—A pro-Nationalist newspaper today said 30 Christian clergymen in the Communist China city of Szeuwei were arrested Monday on charges of guiding a plane which dropped anti-Red leaflets over the city.

The newspaper Wah Kiu Yat Po said the clergymen were tried and beaten, then released.
