

### Great Inventor Figure-8s His Pint-Sized Airplane

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—The youth-ful-looking man stood there holding a little box, carefully fingering a control level, his eyes following the flight of a pint-sized plane which looped and turned and did a figure eight.

The "box" was a transmitter and every motion of the model plane was a response to a radio signal. Suddenly the plane made a loop out of a diving spiral and the man at the "beep" box grinned like a happy kid whose kite had found a sudden breeze on a quiet afternoon.

But his looks and grin belied his age and fame. For the beep box operator was Dr. Walker A. Good, famous physicist whose development of the proximity fuse was one of the most guarded secrets of World War II.

Dr. Good, like more than 1,500 other men (including Air Force and Navy airmen), women, boys and girls who make and fly model airplanes, is competing this week in the "world series" of model flying—the 22nd annual National Model Airplane meet at the naval air station at suburban Willow Grove.

Overhead the skies buzzed with miniature aircraft, some of them launched by hand and others, like Dr. Good's trim little balsam wood craft, by radio.

The Navy back in 1948 recognized the worth of model airplane flying by sponsoring the national meet for the first time at Olathe, Kan.

Navy sponsorship provides the competitors, each of whom is licensed by the Academy of Model Aeronautics, with food—\$1.20 a day—bunks, and an acre or more of hangar space and work benches to repair and build model planes. One of the youngest contestants is 8-year-old Karen Biddle of Neshaunmy, Pa., who has her U-control model plane shipshape for the junior stunt event. Karen already has won prizes in two meets this year—one prize for being the youngest contestant, and the other in a stunt event.

But she seemed unimpressed with winning the stunt event. "It was nothing," she smiled. "I was the only one competing!"

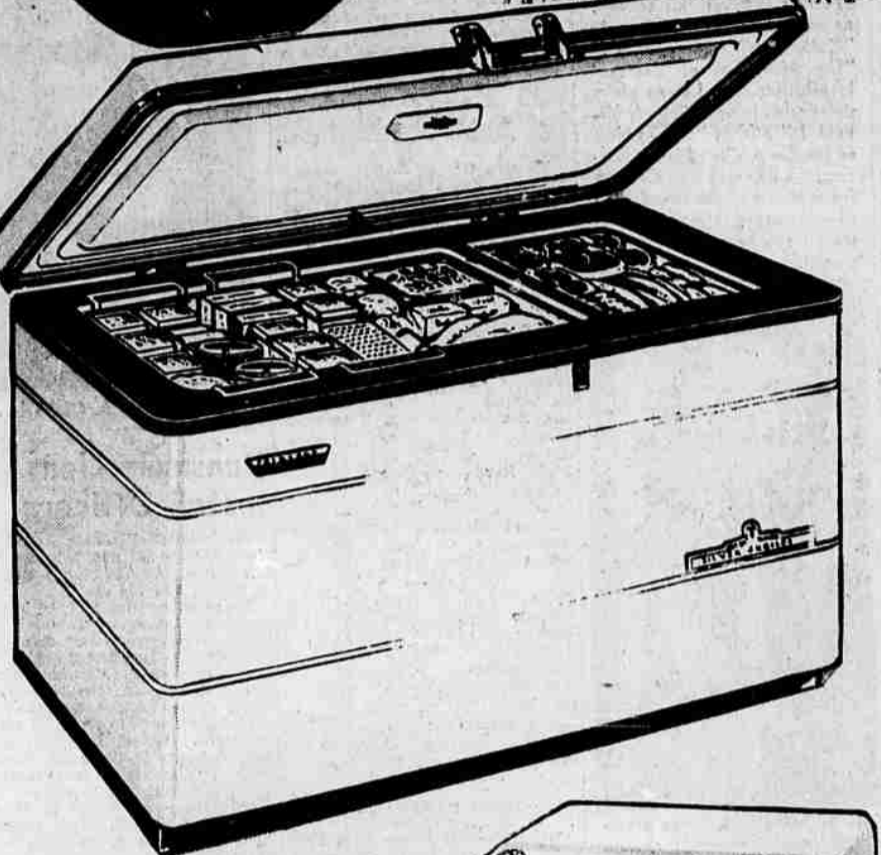

### Liquor Group Asks Break

LOS ANGELES (AP)—A reduction of \$4.50 per gallon in the federal tax rate on liquor has been asked by the National Retail Liquor Package Stores Assn. 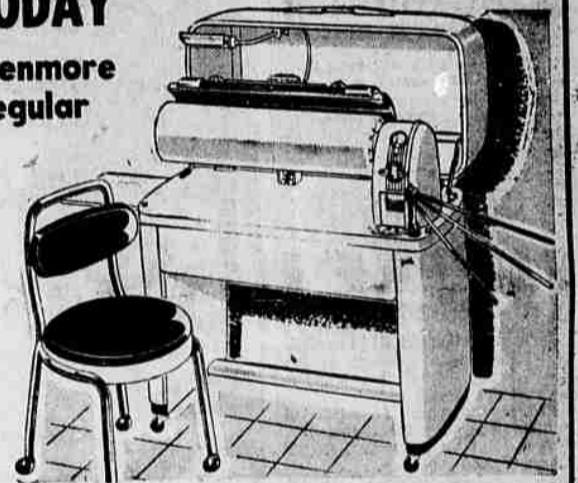

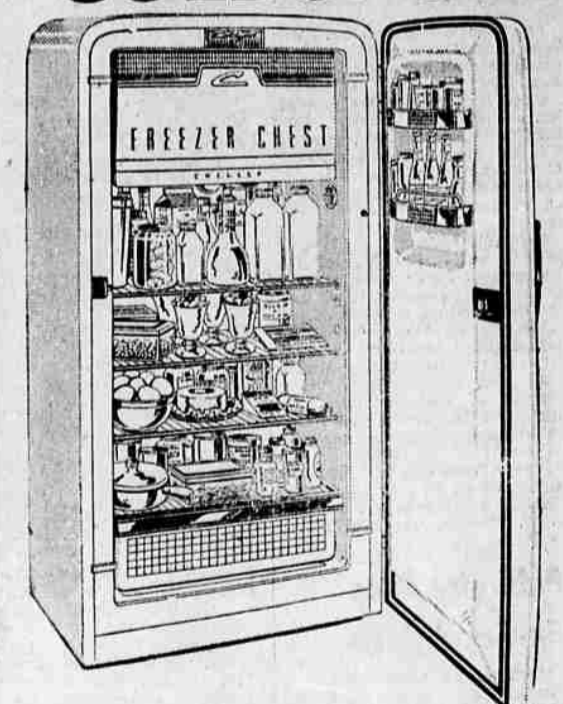
