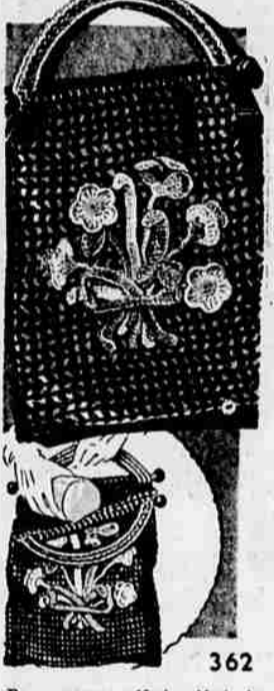

Red Police Confiscate US Gift Food

BERLIN (AP)—Communist police Friday began mass confiscation of U. S. gift food parcels which hungry East Germans are bringing back from free West Berlin. The confiscation campaign began at the big rail terminal in Potsdam, southwest of Berlin, where the Red police intercepted hundreds of persons returning with the food. The Potsdam station was surrounded by police, and the food bearers were herded into an empty room and stripped of their gifts.
