PARIS (AP)—Another vote for the old conservative skirt length came from a surprising quarter last night when Paris' youngest designer, Hubert de Givenchy, held his hemlines down.

His opening—the last of the season's big-name showings—left stylist Christian Dior all alone in plumping for skirts short enough to show midday's calf. On this No. 1 fashion issue of the season, the major Parisian dress houses lined up this way:

Shortest—Dior.
 Not so short—Fath, Lanvin, Desse and Rouff.
 Unchanged—Balmain, Balenciaga, Heim, Griffe, Patou and Givenchy.

Givenchy gave his collection a Far Eastern tone, using Indian and Chinese prints, padded and quilted sheaths and jackets, curly-toed shoes, and tiny Tibetan caps.

He also changed his style completely from last season, abandoning the prettiness and charm of its first creations in favor of chicness and sophistication.

The tiny mannequins who wore his last season fairy-like gowns were gone and in their place strode big strapping girls in new wide-shouldered, high-waisted, big-hipped styles.

His suits have the narrowest possible skirts and a favorite Givenchy dress for next fall and winter is a black wool sheath with a squared-out neckline and medium shoulder straps.

Pneumonia Ends Man - Not Dope, Mercury, Sulphur

BAYREUTH, Germany (AP)—The late Heinrich Kolb, 61, quaffed breakfast coffee loaded with mercury from an old thermometer, a helping of sulphur and a dose of knockout drops.

But when he died, medical authorities said what carried him off was pneumonia.

A German court today sentenced 24-year-old widow Inge Kolb to six years imprisonment for attempted murder. It found her guilty of feeding Heinrich the potent breakfast blast.

The coffee? It caused Heinrich acute discomfort, doctors said, but that was all.

Doukhobors On Rampage

NELSON, B. C. (AP)—One woman was badly burned and several other persons had narrow escapes yesterday when fanatic Doukhobors set fire to 10 homes in the West Kootenays, in Eastern British Columbia.

Six homes were destroyed in a one block area at Krestova, unofficial capital of the Radical Sons of Freedom sect. Royal Canadian Mounted Police said the fires left nearly 30 persons homeless. At Krestova heaps of smoldering and burning ruins marked the 100-foot-square block in the morning.

More than 70 homes have been destroyed by fire this year in the troubled area, about 300 miles east of Vancouver.

83rd Congress First Session Makes Record Appropriation Cut

WASHINGTON (AP)—The expiring first session of the 83rd Congress appropriated 13 billion dollars less than the new money requested by former President Truman in January—a record cut.

In its drive to bring new government obligations closer to its prewar levels, Congress trimmed about four billion dollars from the revised money requests of President Eisenhower.

The 13 billions chopped from the Truman requests represents a reduction of about 20 per cent and is not an all-time record, is a record for modern times. It exceeds by three billions the reduction goal set last January by Chairman Taber (R-NY) of the House Appropriations Committee.

Truman asked Congress for new appropriations of \$66,288,000,000 for the fiscal year that started July 1. Eisenhower scaled this down to \$57,029,000,000.

Both amounts are exclusive of more than seven billions in permanent appropriations, such as interest on the national debt, over which Congress has little or no control.

Congress decided that the federal government must get along on slightly over 53 billions in new money during the present fiscal year.

For the first time in years, there was little disagreement between the Senate and the House over how much should be provided. This year the Senate added less than one billion to amounts voted by the House, and much of that difference was wiped out when the two chambers compromised.

Only two of the annual money bills haven't cleared through Congress. And they are expected to get final approval today.

Ants For 'Naked Jungle' Found Difficult To Locate

Today we take a trip to "The Naked Jungle," which is not to be confused with "The Naked City," or "The Naked Spur." This particular jungle is naked on account of some ants.

The Paramount picture is based on the famous story, "Leiningen vs. the Ants," about a plantation owner in the tropics who is attacked by soldier ants. These ants munch everything in sight, and you can see how it would get to be a problem.

The movie makers also have a problem: photographing ants.

"We had trouble finding any ants in California that could double for the tropical ants," reports Director Byron Haskin. "Soldier ants are over an inch long; the biggest we could get were wood ants, about three-quarter inches. But you put a bunch of them in a scene, get ready to shoot and you can't find them. They don't like the light and they disappear."

"We found six or seven thousand ants in Death Valley that work pretty well," adds Producer George Pal. "But we will have to fly a crew to Central America to get the real thing. Our scouts have located some ant colonies in Panama."

The man who is fighting the ants is stalwart Charlton Heston, who is doing nothing about it when he chews with another actor, William Conrad. He passes between moves to tell about his unique situation.

"My wife and I just got settled in our two apartments—one in New York and the other in Hollywood. Then she got a job in the Chicago company of 'The Seven Year Itch.' Now we have three apartments, plus a house in Michigan."

Meanwhile, Heston, who just got back from Peru, is leaving after the picture for Bermuda, where he'll play in "Macbeth."

We let Heston get back to his chess moves and we call on Eleanor Parker, another ant buster. She also has a domestic situation, but she is getting rid of hers. She is divorcing Bert Friedrich and three children. Hollywood thought it was all very sudden.
