

### Rhee's Demand Highly Lauded

PUSAN, Korea (AP)—The South Korean National Assembly today unanimously backed a demand that President Syngman Rhee's demand that the Allies quit the impending Korean political conference if it fails within three months to reach agreement on unification of Korea.

The action apparently was designed to show a united front to U. S. Secretary of State Dulles, who arrives tomorrow for talks with Rhee.

The Assembly, in a three-point resolution, also demanded:

1. That the conference include only nations whose troops fought in the war.
2. Rejection of any unification plan that overrides the sovereignty of South Korea.

Rhee pledged Sunday he would cooperate with the conference so long as it "stands firm" on its objectives of Korean unification but at the same time indicated he will insist on the 90-day limit.

The conference is scheduled to start in late October. The United Nations General Assembly will begin discussions Aug. 17 to decide its makeup.

Rhee said that if the U. N. should "retreat" from the aim of unification, "we should then have to face the situation alone."

### Scientist Urges Subsidy Of Atom Material Making

WASHINGTON (AP)—A top atomic scientist says the government should underwrite private production of raw materials for atomic weapons, so they would become cheap enough for the widest possible use in wartime.

Edward Teller, one of the planners of the first atomic bomb, wrote the Senate-Atomic Energy Committee that lowering production costs would permit using A-weapons on targets as small as fighter planes and entrenched positions.

### Poly Children See First City

PHOENIX, Ariz. (AP)—The children of Short Creek, Arizona's polygamy colony, had their first look at a city yesterday.

Officers evacuated the 152 youngsters and their 38 mothers in buses after Sheriff Frank Porter said he heard the men of the community plotting to take their families away from Short Creek after being released from jail on bond.

Authorities raided the polygamy colony a week ago Sunday. Thirty-one men and nine women were jailed.

The children who were brought here yesterday appeared wide-eyed and enthusiastic on their arrival. They stood in awe of the tall downtown buildings.

For most, it was the first time they had seen neon lights, pavements or modern buildings.

State welfare officers hurried them off to foster homes, where they will remain until juvenile court officers decide their futures.

Minutes after Arizona authorities removed the children from Short Creek, 31 men and 9 women freed from Kingman jail on bond began to return home.

Only a handful of boys, left to tend to the cattle, greeted them.

### Grew Called All Shots on Japan Since About '35

WASHINGTON (AP)—Joseph G. Grew, U. S. ambassador to Japan before World War II, foresaw six years before Pearl Harbor that Japan might have "a tremendous clash with the Western Powers, in which, presumably, Japan would be crushed."

But "such a vigorous nation as Japan" would rise again after one or two generations, Grew said in one of 1,111 hitherto secret documents made public over the weekend by the State Department.

### Cooler North, Sticky South

Showers and thunderstorms which cooled off the northern half of the nation Sunday continued Monday.

But below St. Louis and Kansas City, through the south and southwest, another day of steaming 90s and 100s was in prospect.

Cooling air dropped temperatures in the north Sunday as much as 30 degrees, to a high of 56 at Yellowstone Park and 28 degrees, to a maximum of 70 at Pierre, S. D.

But it was 100 again at St. Louis and Kansas City, and 100-degree readings were common in central and western Texas, and the southeast's temperatures were mainly in the 90s.

The rains brought 1.58 inches in six hours to Lamar in Colorado's drought area, and 24-hour totals of 2.32 and 1.01 were reported at Galveston, Tex., and New Orleans, respectively.

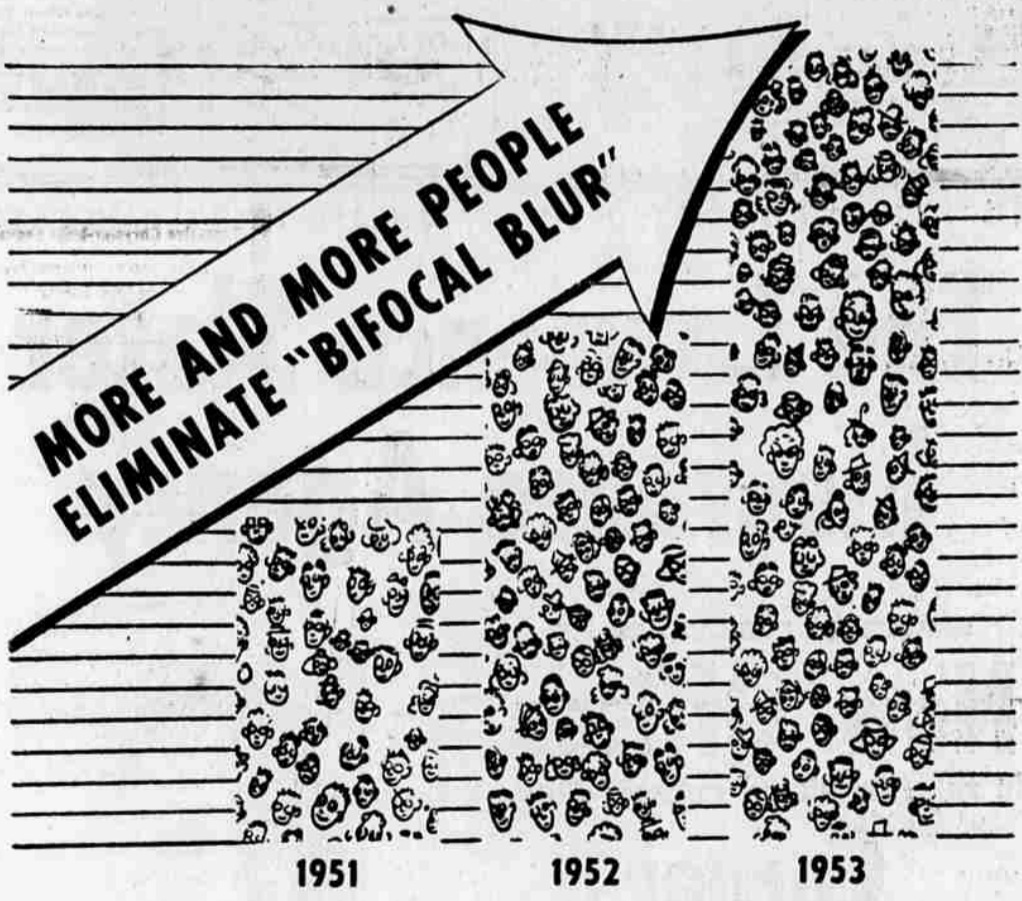
