**West Wheat Allotments Hit**

DENVER, Colo. (AP)—Wheat allotments given Western states contain so many inequities that farmers may turn down marketing quotas in the Aug. 14 referendum.

Harvey Solberg, president of the Rocky Mountain Farmers Union, asserted in messages to Colorado congressmen.

Individual Colorado farmers, he said, have had wheat package allowances cut 30 per cent, compared with 20 to 25 per cent for Montana, Nebraska and Kansas. This additional cut, Solberg said, could cost Coloradans 10 million dollars next year.

He expressed hope that the marketing quota program would be approved and inequities corrected later.

**Woman Wasn't Speeding: Hair Stayed Unmussed**

SYRACUSE, N. Y. (AP)—"I couldn't have been speeding, Judge. My hair didn't get mussed up."

That was the defense Patricia A. Bull, a pretty, 25-year-old school teacher put up in traffic court yesterday when she appeared on a charge of exceeding the city speed limit of 25 miles an hour.

Miss Bull, of nearby Oswego, told Judge Truman E. Preston she'd made numerous tests with the top down on her convertible. When she stayed under 25, she said, her hair stayed in place. Over 25, she told the judge, her hair got wind-blown.

And since, she concluded, her hair wasn't mussed on July 25, she shouldn't have been going 35 miles an hour, as charged.

Preston's verdict: innocent.
