## Hope Interviewed Among Rhubarb, Chops, Yogurt

**BOLLYWOOD** — The time has come to interview Bob Hope and it is like interviewing a whirlwind. I tried three times on the set of "Cas-

anova's Big Night." Three times Hope was lost in a flurry of agents, visiting dignitaries, gag men and a giddy producer named Paul Jones.

So I grabbed him in his only moments of repose — the lunch hour. He sank into his dressing room chair and ordered a luncheon of yogurt and rhubarb, with lamb chops as an afterthought because he needed the protein for a dueling scene.

Hope is an ardent TV watcher and he was discussing the Hoagy Carmichael show on Saturday nights: "They've got some good young comics on that show — George Gobel and Paul Gilbert are two of them. Good new comedians are coming up, thanks to TV. Carmichael is good too. Nice and easy; plays himself. Would I like an easier pace on TV? No, I couldn't do it. People expect a fast pace from me. That's the way I am."

## Big Shakeup Of Justice Made

**WASHINGTON** (AP) — Atty. Gen. Brownell told newsmen Saturday that since Jan. 20 the Justice Department has had its "biggest shakeup for any comparable period on record."

Rogers said that in the first six months of the Republican regime, 223 changes had been made in important justice jobs, not counting lesser ones, as compared with 102 changes carried out in the first half year of 1953, which started the long Roosevelt administration.

The attorney general asserted that to date he had ended the services of 124 of the department's 1,100 staff lawyers, that replacements had not been made in all cases, and that a general reorganization in the department force, normally around 30,000 was being carried out. The overall total of dismissals was not immediately available.

In the field of major jobs, Rogers reported 60 of the 94 U.S. district attorneys replaced, changes made in 109 assistant attorney post 38 new U.S. marshals installed; 16 executive posts in the department requiring Senate confirmation turned over; and 14 new federal judges appointed and confirmed.

## Has Russia Got H-Bomb?

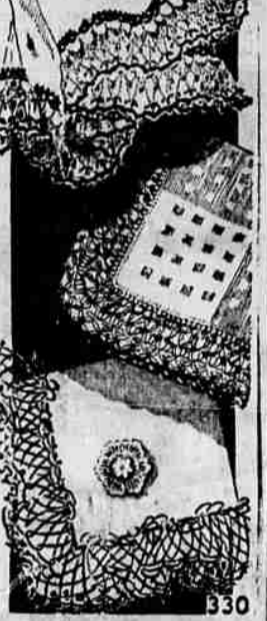
**ALTOONA, Pa.** (AP) — Rep. James Van Zandt (R-Pa.), a member of the joint Atomic Energy Committee, said Saturday he doubts very much if Russia has developed a hydrogen bomb. He said: "Why we didn't know we had one ourselves, until last October when we exploded a hydrogen device. There hasn't been any word reach Washington that Russia has exploded a hydrogen device."

**OAKLAND, Calif.** (AP) — Sen. William W. Knowland, a member of the Atomic Energy Committee, suggested Saturday the possibility of a "fishing expedition" by the Russians in their announcement they have the hydrogen bomb. He suggested the Russians might be seeking information by reaction to Malenkov's announcement.

**CHICAGO** (AP) — A Chicago atomic scientist who helped develop the world's first nuclear reactor said Saturday he would be a "bit surprised" if Russia has mastered production of a hydrogen bomb "so soon."

But Dr. Herbert L. Anderson of the University of Chicago added that "I see no reason to believe if Malenkov's statement is not true today it will not be next year." He added: "We must expect that ultimately if we can make the H-bomb so can the Russians. Nothing stands in their way except figuring out how to do it. They have the industrial potential, the scientific background, and the raw materials to do it."
