### Two Kinds Of Travelers Cross Paths At Naples

NAPLES (AP)—Two kinds of travelers cross paths in this busy Italian port.

There are those with American dollars in their pockets coming to visit the land of their forefathers. And there are those who, with tears in their eyes, are leaving Italy in search of a better life.

Recently, the U. S. luxury liner Constitution pulled into port just as the 8,550-ton Argentine steamer Salta drew up its anchor. Aboard the Salta were 344 Italians, mostly women and children, beginning the longest voyage of their lives. They were bound for Buenos Aires to join fathers, brothers and sons.

From the Constitution gangplank stepped successful Italian emigrants, or sons of emigrants,

their sleek baggage contrasting sharply with the bundled packages of the Salta passengers.

The 344 Italians sailing on the Salta were the first of an estimated 100,000 to be transferred to Argentina under a program sponsored by the Inter-Government Committee for European Migration, backed financially by the United States.

Slowly they went aboard, carrying their possessions in bags, cartons, sacks and wooden boxes tied with ropes.

Concetta Canastra, leaving Italy for the first time at 65, looked off to sea with her daughter and three grandchildren.

"My son went to Buenos Aires three years ago because the 500 lire (85 cents) he earned as truck driver here was not enough. Now he has a job in a garage in Argentina. He sends us money every

month. But there are still times when we do not have any bread." Old Signora Canastra had tears in her eyes as the ship sailed. "We cannot forget we are Italians," she said.

### Indiana Boy Wins Soapbox

AKRON, Ohio (AP)—Freddy Mohler of Muncie, Ind., barred by his health from most boyhood sports, headed home Monday as king of the nation's soap boxers.

The 14-year-old, 93-pound youngster, pounding out the five fastest times of the day, defeated 150 other teen-agers from 40 states, Alaska and Germany in the 16th All-American Soap Box Derby here Sunday.

For his victory Freddy received a \$5,000 college scholarship. Although he'll just be entering grade 9-B in Wilson Junior High School next month, he's made up his mind about college.

He said he'd attend Ball State Teachers College in his home town, and become an industrial arts teacher. His dad, Ernest R. Mohler, is a school building custodian in Muncie.

Freddy was under 28 seconds for all five of his heats down the 975.4-foot runway, and he was the only one in the far-flung field able to crack that time. The races were run straight into a 20-mile wind, and through intermittent showers.

### White House Moved To Denver

DENVER (AP)—"Denver White House," the telephone operator greets you when you call President Eisenhower's vacation headquarters at Lowry Air Force Base.

The President's modest office is in the base administration building. It's a room about 12 by 15 feet, less than a third the size of the presidential office in Washington.

On newly lettered signs over other office doors down the corridor are the names of the small staff of aides who accompanied Eisenhower from Washington.

### Solon Wouldn't Sell Red Claim Short

ALBUQUERQUE (AP)—Sen. Anderson (D-NM) says he "wouldn't sell Russia short" on Premier Malenkov's statement that Russia has the hydrogen bomb.

Anderson said on his return from Washington that "it is not a certainty that Russia has the H-bomb, but it is a definite possibility."

A member of the House-Senate Committee on Atomic Energy, Anderson said that Russian progress on atomic research has been very rapid.

### Boys Borrow, Wreck Police Boat, Flee

WORCESTER, Mass. (AP)—Two youths stole the police patrol boat yesterday, cruised about three hours on Lake Quinsigamond and then wrecked the craft on the lake bank.

Neighbors said that after police searched a nearby field, the two boys dropped out of an apple tree and sped away.

### Woman Reduces 265 to 155 lbs. In 2,000 Miles

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Mrs. Helen Fedorowicz, 42, lost 110 pounds in four months, but her reducing method probably won't become popular.

It was her husband's idea anyway. Mrs. Fedorowicz is only 5 feet tall, but she weighed 265 pounds that day in April when her spouse, John, 59, a roofer, said to her: "Let's take a walk."

They did. They started at Fresno and trudged 350 miles to the Mexican border. Then they turned eastward, over mountains and desert, camping at night and braving all kinds of weather.

Two thousand miles later Mrs. Fedorowicz weighed a mere 155. She plans to stay home and soak her feet awhile.
