

### Is Cinerama Missing Boat On New Movie Market?

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Is Cinerama missing the boat in the race for the new movie market?  
Many insiders in the film industry think so. Even Variety launched an editorial chiding the company for failing to cash in on the new dimensional revolution which Cinerama itself started. The show business paper cited the company's internal differences, which it said had held back expansion of the three-camera, three-projector movie device.

Merian C. Cooper, who put together the first attraction, "This Is Cinerama," comes to the company's defense.  
"I don't think we have missed the boat," said the vice president in charge of production. "I believe we should have had more theaters open by now. But part of that is because we didn't have the money. Nobody would believe that this thing was going to work."

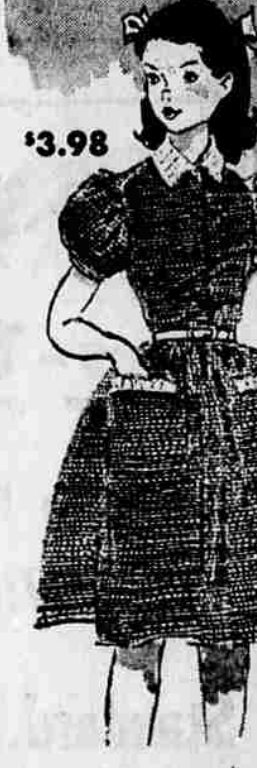
