SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—An officer at Marine Corps headquarters here proposes eliminating dashes from Morse code.
 They're just a waste of transmitter power, Capt. Nils B. E. Forsberg said yesterday in announcing he'd devised a code composed entirely of dots.
 Forsberg said he has copyrighted the all-dot code and submitted it for Navy tests. He claims it saves 25 per cent of transmitter input power.

Tent City Goes Up For Ex-Red POWs

MUNSAN, Korea (AP)—A huge tent city is being built near Pannum-jom to house 23,000 North Korean and Chinese prisoners who refused repatriation.
 Some 3,000 Army engineers, erecting 1,100 tents. They will house not only the prisoners but medical and Red Cross units, guard troops, supervisory personnel and Communist officers who will attempt to convince the POWs to return to their homelands.
