Life Oversees No America

Life in Vienna is a dramatic change from Klamath Falls for the family of Anneli Uherek, who left here several months ago for an indefinite stay in their native Austria. Mrs. Uherek operated the Viennese School of Dance while in Klamath Falls.

She and her husband found particularly amusing, the effort to get a driver's license. First, they were put in a small cabin without windows and left to wait. Then the applicants were let in "one by one" to a doctor who gave a minute physical examination. In her very descriptive letter, Mrs. Uherek says that the same exam has to be taken every year for license renewal and that it takes "an awful lot of time," and you should see all the serious faces, so all-important and never a smile.

Their DKW (German motor car) is a two cylinder, a ratty, shaky, 20 year old vehicle, but she writes that it is an automobile that permits getting around and out of Vienna.

Those applying for a driver's permit must also know every single part of the car and all the rudiments of operation.

Mrs. Uherek saw a dance recital of the famous Rosalie Chladek, in early June but noted the wide difference between recitals in Europe and in Klamath Falls.

In a recent letter to Mrs. Fred Goeller, Mrs. Uherek noted that every thing was done the hard way in Vienna and that her husband Hans brags about "how things are done over there," meaning America.

Because of the economic situation in Europe it is impossible, she writes to modernize things on a large scale. Big businessmen have cars, a bathroom, refrigerators, but electric washing machines are still a rarity.

American women live like princesses in comparison with women in Vienna, according to Mrs. Uherek.

Household help is paid a pittance and the 430 schillings they earn a month will buy one dress, worth about six dollars in America.

Women's and girls' dresses, suits and coats are worn very short in Vienna and quality clothes are hard to buy. Medical care is far below average.

The Uhereks celebrated the Fourth of July with Hans wearing his Western shirt and the party caused quite a stir in a restaurant they visited for dinner. Mrs. Uherek celebrated by going to a reception at the American Ambassador's villa and guests who had no transportation were taken home in Chevrolets, but Mrs. Uherek and her party were taken in a Cadillac by friends of Ambassador Thompson.

They also heard a patriotic American program over an American radio station which included a reading of the Constitution of the United States and folk songs.

She writes about the lack of canned food in Vienna, especially mayonnaise, which she cannot get in Vienna stores, the size of the extra big pillows used, and the high cost of soap and her hope that she will soon return to America.
