In Sesslers' win over Pooles, Earl Tichenor pitched a no-hit ball game for two innings and struck out the six men to face him. Tichenor's team mates jumped on Larry Bean and Miller for 13 runs in the first inning. Metlers only collected three hits off Sons of Norway pitchers McGill and Dixon but errors by the Sons made the difference. Richard Detroit shut out the Sons of Norway hitters with one hit. This is the second one-hit shutout he has thrown this season. Bucky Hamlin was the big stick for the lumbermen by clouting a long triple to aid Detroit in his win over the fourth place Sons of Norway. There will be no playoff to determine who will be the champion and the all-star team that is usually picked at the end of the season will also be dropped for this season. ## Broncs Slice Indian Lead to Half Game

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS The Spokane Indians still topped Western International Baseball League standings Friday but thanks to Bill Brenner and his fast-rising Lewiston Broncs their first-place margin was down to a slim one-half game. Brenner, Lewiston's pitcher-manager, tamed the Indians with six hits Thursday night as the Broncs made it three straight in the series, 5-1. Salegn, meanwhile, clubbed Tri-City 2-5 and moved to within three percentage points of the Indians. In other games, Wenatchee downed Yakima 7-5, Edmondton whipped Victoria 8-4, and Vancouver subdued Calgary 11-6. Two of the six hits given up by Brenner at Lewiston were successive sixth-inning doubles by Eddie Murphy and Jimmy Brown. They accounted for Spokane's only run as Brenner racked up his 18th win against 10 losses. At Salem, Gene Roenspie recorded his 17th win against three defeats in turning back Tri-City's Braves. A five-run fourth inning led the game for the Senators and gave them a 2-1 edge in the series. The Wenatchee Chiefs stretched their winning streak to five straight with their triumph over Yakima. The Chiefs clinched the game with a four-run outburst in the seventh. Catcher John Albini homered twice for Yakima, driving in all the Bears' runs, and Ross McCormack sent one out of the park for Wenatchee. Vancouver scored five times in the top of the ninth to win the wild affair at Calgary. Three of the runs were on Gene Petrolli's round-tripper after two were out. K Chorlton also homered for the Capitanos and Ken Whitehead and Don Hunter circled the bases for Calgary. Ray McNulty was credited with his 14th win of the season as Edmondton upset Victoria in the first of a four-game series at Edmondton.

## KF Pro's Brother In Lead

SALT LAKE CITY (AP)—Golf veteran George Schnetter of Salt Lake City fired a sizzling 64 around the par-72 Country Club course Thursday as a record field of 153 opened play in the 29th annual Utah Open Golf Tournament. Schnetter is a brother of Earl Schnetter, Klamath Falls golf pro also entered in the meet. Schnetter's 30-34-64 gave him a four-stroke lead over Zell Easton, Portland, Ore., who whacked a 34-34-68. Two golfers, picked by fans to top the field in the annual Calculutta drawing, trailed the leaders. Harold West of Pendleton, Ore., first in the Calculutta, fired a 2-under-par 70, and ex-champ Smiley Quick of Los Angeles was way back with a 75. Quick was second in the Calculutta. Tied with West at 70 were Walt Gresham, Salt Lake City, and Bob Harriw, Montebello, Calif.

## State Fishing 'Fair to Good'

PORTLAND (AP)—Oregon's fishing has been generally fair to good, the State Game Commission reported Thursday. Mount Hood-area streams in Northwest Oregon are clearing and fishing is fair, but the Sandy River is poor. Fishing continues fair on the McKenzie and Willamette Rivers and their tributaries. Clear and Dorena Lakes are slow. Salmon fishing is improving inside the mouth of the Columbia and is fair at Nehalem Bay. Angling in tide-water for sea-run cutthroat has been slow. Salmon fishing has been good at Winchester Bay in Southwestern Oregon. Trout fishing is fair and improving in Tenmile Lake where perch and catfish angling is fair. No good catches of sea-run cutthroat have been reported. Salmon fishing in the Lower Rogue is good and steelhead angling offshore has been fair. Trout fishing is poor but improving in the Rogue. Lake of the Woods is fair to poor. In Central Oregon fly fishing is excellent in Blue Lake. Angling is very good in Three Creeks Lake. East and Paulina Lakes and Wicklup Reservoir are fair. Irish and Taylor Lakes are good. The upper Deschutes River is expected to continue good. Willowa Mountain high lakes in Northeastern Oregon have been generally good. Good catches have been made in Eagle and Pine Creeks and the Willowa River has been fair. Some steelhead are being taken in the Grand Ronde and John Day Rivers.

## Seals Eye Fourth Position

The Seals made a game, uphill fight against Los Angeles and whipped the Angels in the 10th inning, 5-3. The victory, coupled with Portland's loss to Seattle Thursday night, moved the Seals to within a half game of the Beavers. Since Portland and San Francisco do not play each other again this year, how they fare against other clubs will decide the issue.

## Barber Fires Torrid 64

MONTREAL (AP)—Jerry Barber, a skinny little fellow who looks as if a healthy golf swing would blow him off the tee, Friday was the biggest shot around this northwest Montreal course. The five-foot-five 140-pounder, usually just another name in the winter and summer circuit, charged down the wide-open fairways of the par-70 layout Thursday in the opening round of the \$25,000 Open, leaving a trail of seven birdies for a record-breaking 64. Only one hole—the tough par-four 17th—forced him to go over regulation figures. The 36-year-old native of LaCanada, Calif., went into the second round one stroke up on Max Evans of Detroit who carded a 65.

## THREE STRAIGHT

Seattle's victory, 6-1, was its third straight over Portland. Previous to the Beaver series Seattle was deep in a most disastrous slump that saw them drop out of contention while Hollywood pulled away to an 11½-game lead at one point. Vern Kindsvater gave Portland 10 hits Thursday night but kept them scattered. Seattle made its eighth hit count.
