

# Germany Back In Shipping

BONN, Germany (AP)—West German announced plans today to resume transatlantic passenger ship service for the first time since 1939.

The Federal Transport Ministry said "successful conclusion" of negotiations by German shipping firms to operate the 16,777-ton liner Italia and the 19,106-ton Gripsholm is expected shortly. They would be used to start service from Hamburg and Bremerhaven to North America.

The Gripsholm, famed as a World War II exchange ship, is owned by the Swedish-American Lines. The Italia, a Panamanian-registered vessel, belongs to the Home Lines, Inc., of Panama and Genoa, Italy.

The ministry said the Hamburg America Line and North German Lloyd, which dominated pre-war Germany's shipping service, have been negotiating for months for the use of the two ships.

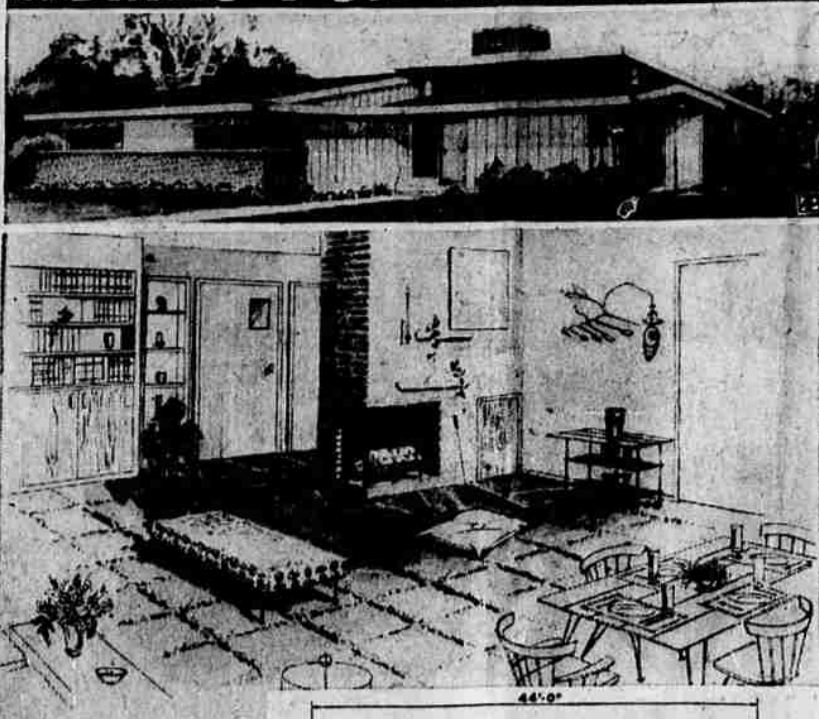

## Tyrone Power Breaks Trip To Make Film, Await Birth

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—The much-traveled Tyrone Power is back in Hollywood to await the birth of his second child and to make a picture before continuing his journeys about the globe. Ty's wife, Linda Christian, is expected to give birth in about a week.

Having served valiantly in "Lloyds of London" and "A Yank in the RAF," Ty is again saving the British Empire in "King of the Khyber Rifles." That's a 19th century India tale being told by 20th Century-Fox, Power's old lot.

"Started here 17 years ago!" said the actor, who is as deucedly handsome as ever. "I've got a listing of the talent at the studio in those days. Not one player is still here!"

Even Power is connected with the studio only in a limited sense. He has but one more picture promised to the lot after this one. Otherwise, he's a free agent. And that's the way he likes it.

I've always suspected that Ty has a little Gypsy mixed up with his Irish blood. As soon as his family gets squared away and he finishes a stage tour, he'll take off for Brazil to take part in the Sao Paulo 400th anniversary fete. "Lorenzo the Magnificent" with his own company.

"I wouldn't mind signing with Fox for one picture a year," he remarked. "Then I could make pictures in the spring and summer and devote the fall and winter to stage and other work."

Ty has been touring the land with the concert version of "John Brown's Body" and he'll return with Raymond Massey and Anne Baxter as soon as he finishes the picture. He is more enthused about this stage presentation than he has ever been about a picture.

"It's fantastically easy, and very rewarding too," he remarked. "All I have to do is get to a town—we usually travel by bus—get settled in a hotel, put on evening clothes, walk to the theater and right onstage. It's as simple as that."

"And the show is a thorough delight. I've played it 150 times or more and I never get tired of it. Maybe it's because the roles are so varied."

Ty and the other stars portray a number of figures in the Civil War era and reach a number of dramatic peaks.

"It's an amazing new medium that Charles Laughton has devised," he remarked. "We never really play the characters; we talk about them. Yet when we do, we reach emotional excitement."

"This kind of presentation has immense possibilities. You can take any classic off the shelves and present it in an exciting, theatrical manner. You can—if you have a great talent like Laughton to do the editing and staging."

While Power has returned to 20th Century-Fox, it isn't exactly in the manner to which he has been accustomed. When he was under exclusive contract to the studio, his dressing room on the set was a plush plaid affair complete with leather furniture and hunting prints. He also had his own roomy apartment in the stars' building.

While his co-star Terry Moore has a fancy dressing room on the set, I found Ty in a smaller leanto of the kind that generally houses featured players. Since Clifton Webb has been given Ty's old apartment, Ty has been assigned another one. He hasn't been in it. Nor has he complained about not getting his old dressing room, which apparently is not in use by anyone else.

All this could have been caused by his balking at the "Khyber Rifles" script when he first returned here.

**CZECH ACCIDENTS UP**
