Pilot Wants to Wring Hand Of Wife's Dancing Partner

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., (AP)—A jet pilot too tough for the Reds to crack is looking for a man whose name he doesn't know to say thanks for a memory. That memory literally pulled Lt. Col. Thomas Harrison of Clovis, N. M., through months of imprisonment, cruelty and torture as a prisoner of the Chinese Reds. Harrison's search is for a man, once an Albuquerque contractor, whom he met only casually 3 1/2 years ago. The Air Force officer asked The Associated Press to help find the man.

"I don't know who he is, but I would appreciate it if you would help me find him so that he would know that he gave someone a lot of help when he needed it," Harrison wrote.

Last Casualty List Readied; Only Few Unaccounted For

WASHINGTON (AP)—The last daily casualty list of the Korean War has been sent out by the Pentagon, one month after the firing ceased along the Far Eastern battle front.

Harrison wrote that after he lost his left leg when shot down in North Korea, his right leg became infected and he was afraid he would lose it too. He said there was no one to talk to, nothing to do but lie and stare at his prison cell ceiling.

144 U.S. GIs Freed Today

PANMUNJOM (AP)—Returning American prisoners today accused the Communists of continuing brutally and torture right up to the armistice—but behind closed doors where they could not be seen.

"Naturally I began to worry about my future and tried to remember all that I could about articles which each serviceman registers when he puts on his uniform. Although the Pentagon has discontinued both its weekly summary of casualties and the daily lists, the checking and rechecking of casualty information will go on for months and possibly years until the Defense Department closes its books on the third costliest foreign war in U. S. history.

Pro-Hells Canyonites Ask More Time to Prepare Case

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Power Commission is considering an appeal by public power advocates for more time to prepare their fight against a private utility's plan to build three dams in the Hells Canyon area, where a federal project has been proposed.

"A recess of moderate duration now would reduce the frequency and length of subsequent recesses and would generally lead to more orderly procedure," Mrs. Cooper said in her appeal.

"It is unthinkable that the commission would permit a hearing of this magnitude and importance to degenerate further by a protraction of these procedural disorders."

Declaring six weeks isn't enough, Mrs. Cooper asked the commission to extend the hearing resumption date from Sept. 21 to Nov. 9.

She also asked the commission to make arrangements for her to confer meanwhile with prospective government witnesses and to study government data.

Mrs. Cooper made two alternative suggestions in the event the longer recess is denied:

1. That witnesses from the Interior Department and Army engineers be called to testify before Idaho Power witnesses are cross-examined and that a 90-day recess be ordered then to give intervenors time to prepare cross-examination for Interior, Army and Idaho Power witnesses.

2. Should both motions be denied, that the present recess be extended to Oct. 12.
