

Roseburger Hangs 5 Crimes, Bad Names, On Ex-Client

ROSEBURG (AP) — William Frank Corey, accused of kidnapping the wife of an attorney who once de-

fended him, was charged with five crimes here Friday. They are kidnapping, armed robbery, assault with a deadly weapon, being an ex-convict in possession of firearms and petty larceny. Corey is accused of abducting Mrs. William H. Jones last Wednesday night at Roseburg and driving her to Medford, of taking \$1,800 from her after forcing her to cash a check for that sum, of firing a shot which penetrated a car door near Mrs. Jones and of stealing a pistol from Jones and carrying it. Corey, when he appeared in court Friday, pleaded innocent to the gun theft charge and asked preliminary hearings on the other charges. Jones, who as an attorney won a burglary charge acquittal for Corey last spring, signed the complaints. Corey tried to speak to Jones after the arraignment but Jones refused.

"I've got nothing more to say to you, you snake, you human cobra," Jones said. Corey then said, "Bill, you'll be sorry you put those charges on me."

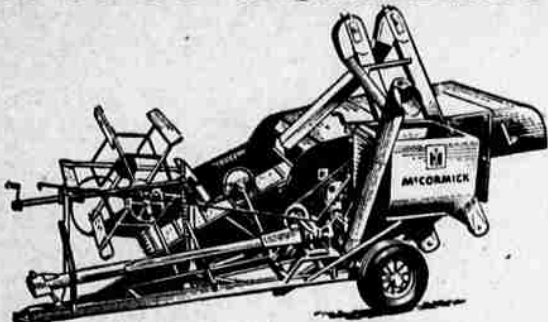
