DETROIT (AP) — The scrap heap will claim another three million or more worn out passenger automobiles this year, if authoritative estimates are approximately correct. On first sight the figures probably don't mean much to the average motorist. However, they are important to him and to the automobile industry in which every motorist has a direct or indirect interest.

Farm Prices Still Drop

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Agriculture Department says, prices farmers receive for their products declined four-tenths of one percent in the month ending in mid-August, to a point 13 per cent lower than the mid-August, 1952, level.

At the same time, the Department reported Friday, the general level of prices paid by farmers for commodities rose one point to 262 per cent of the 1910-14 average.

The majority declines in prices received were for cattle, hogs and lambs. Partly offsetting the drop were higher prices for milk, eggs, cotton and lettuce.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics said that wholesale prices in central declined one-tenth of one percent during the week ended Aug. 25, to 110.7 per cent of the 1947-49 average.

Weyerhaeuser Reports New Utilization

LONGVIEW (AP) — Another stride forward in utilizing woods ordinarily of no great value was disclosed here Saturday.

R. E. Baker, manager of the Weyerhaeuser Timber Company's Longview pulp division, said equipment is being installed to process several species of small-diameter woods for Kraft pulp production.

He expects the new operation to be completed by mid-October and said it will be the first of its kind for the firm.

Part of the needed equipment, a particular mechanical barker, has been manufactured in Sweden. It was obtained there, rather than in this country, he said, to expedite delivery by next week.

The machine, he explained, is equipped with a rotary ring holding sharp-tipped tools which strip bark from logs under pneumatic pressure. In contrast to hydraulic barkers using powerful jets of water.

It will handle all types of woods up to a maximum 29 inches in diameter, he said. Most of the logs will be in eight-foot lengths.

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Reds Drum Up Wild Beast Hunts In Game-Free Area; Tough Figuring What's Up

HONG KONG (AP) — Broadcasts speaking of "wild beast hunts" for tigers and panthers in Communist China have listeners in this crown colony—and possibly even on the Red mainland—wondering what's going on behind the Bamboo Curtain.

Suddenly the Red radio broadcasts are full of talk of "hunting the beasts in the mountains and saving the crops"—all this in a land where few predatory animals exist.

Figure this one out from Radio Hupoh or Hankow in Central China:

"When we hunt beasts we must

respect tribal habits and customs. When the beasts hide in graveyards or temples we must obey tribal custom on whether to shoot them or not."

Radio Sian in Shensi province has spilled out hundreds of words aimed at organizing hunting parties to kill "the beasts in the mountains and save the crops."

This double talk may point to one thing: some sort of trouble, possibly even uprisings, is brewing in Red China.

The radios, however, give no clue who the rebels are. They never depart from "beast" talk—and never mention any animals other than tigers or panthers.

Possibly the Reds are recruiting hunters without knowing what they will hunt. But it must be big game, as Radio Yunnan indicated in this broadcast:

"If hunters are killed pensions will be supplied... peasants or hunters who have died while hunting or who have been wounded when seized by the beasts will be helped by the government..."

"When a hunter hunts beasts, his neighbors must help him take care of his farm... Hunters with extra guns must lend them to other hunters..."

"Poison arrows must not be used... The government will supply hunters with money for ammunition and guns but those who can should make their own ammunition..."

"We must protect the people, cattle and farm plants from beast calamities." It may sound like a mystery thriller—or is it trouble behind the Bamboo Curtain?

Vet's Mailbag

The Veterans Administration has announced that in compliance with new requirements of the law gratuity payments will not be made to veterans who obtain G.I. loans after Aug. 31st.

Previously, veterans who obtained G.I. loans were given a gratuity payment equal to 4 per cent of the guaranteed portion of the loan up to a maximum of \$160. These payments were credited to the veterans' loan accounts by the lenders.

The VA said that Public Law 149, 83rd Congress, which was approved by the President on July 27th, provides for the suspension of G.I. loan gratuity payments during the ten-month period Sept. 1, 1953, to June 30, 1954.

According to the VA, where loans have been initiated prior to the cut-off date gratuity payments may be made after Aug. 31 only if the loans fall within the following categories:

1. A loan on which the VA has issued an evidence of guaranty or insurance or has issued a certificate of commitment dated prior to Sept. 1.
2. A loan which has been closed and actually paid out in full prior to Sept. 1 by a supervised lender.
3. A VA direct loan which has been closed or the VA has issued a notice of approval or a commitment prior to the cut-off date.

The VA is urging all lenders to avoid any delays in processing loan papers which might deprive a veteran of his loan gratuity.

Question of the Week
Q. I'm drawing compensation for a service-connected disability I received in Korea. I was on active duty for two years. Am I automatically entitled to vocational rehabilitation training at government expense?

A. No, not necessarily. One requirement of the law is that you must need the training to overcome the handicap of your disability.

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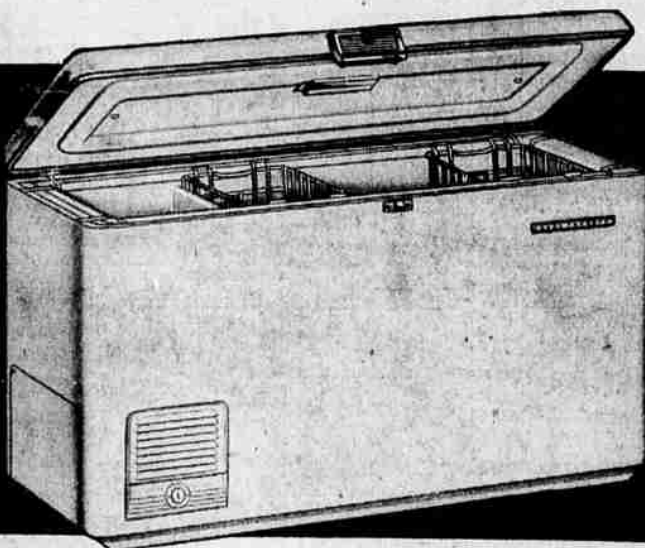
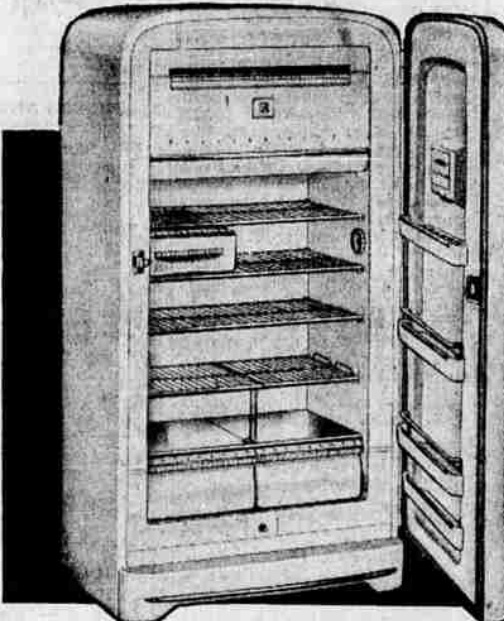
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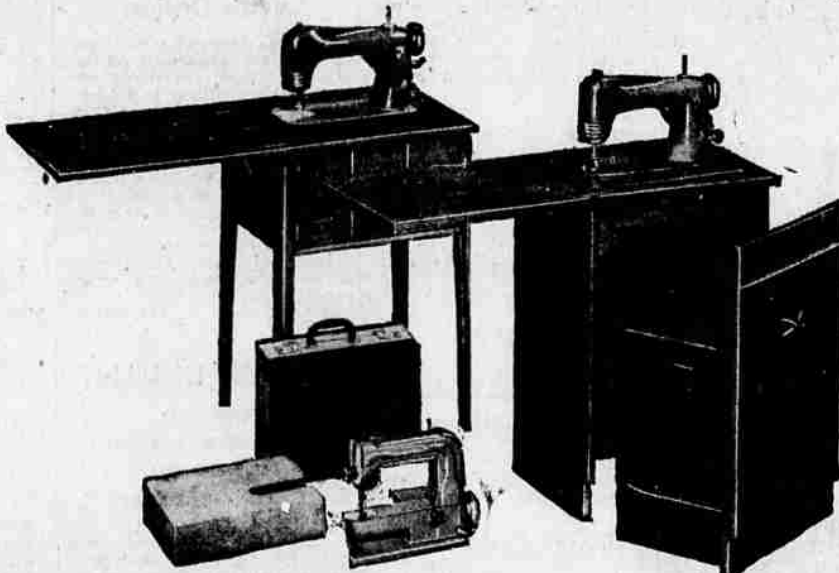


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
