WASHINGTON (AP)—FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover says that, statistically, the trend is toward a record amount of criminal activity in the United States this year.

Statistics on the first half of 1953, compiled from police reports throughout the country and released Saturday in the FBI's semi-annual "Uniform Crime Reports," showed a total of 1,047,290 major crimes committed.

The total for all of 1952 was 2,036,000.
