Accused Slayer Changes Plea

TOLEDO, Ore. (AP)—Richard Thomson, 25, accused of attempting to slay his business partner, Monday repudiated an earlier confession and changed his plea to innocent.
He was charged with assault with intent to kill James K. Meuller, 31, by striking him in the head with an iron pipe. Last Tuesday he pleaded guilty to the charge after signing a statement admitting the assault. Thomson said that after slugging Meuller, he lost control of the car in which they were riding along the Coast Highway. The car plunged over a 500-foot cliff at Otter Crest.
Thomson said he was thrown out as the car started the plunge. Meuller was hurled 350 feet down the slope and the car dropped another 150 feet. Meuller was severely injured but is recovering.
Thomson said Monday that he had signed the statement while under "great mental strain."
His attorney asked for a delay to prepare Thomson's defense.

Man Loose Minus Pants Was More Than Justified

MUSKOGEE, Okla. (AP)—R. J. Cross, 64-year-old Muskogee county resident, was stopped by officers as he ran down the highway without trousers.
It was a little unusual because the elderly bricklayer had just been pried loose from his car after laying upside down 42 hours partially submerged in water.
The auto had jumped an embankment on U.S. Highway 69, fallen 35 feet into the river, and overturned. A trailer it was pulling fell on top of the car.
A farmer heard Cross' tapping the following morning and notified officers who rescued him. When the wicker chair opened the door and freed Cross he jumped out and darted down the highway yelling, "I'm all right."
He was caught and taken to a hospital suffering from shock and exposure but was otherwise in good condition.
