Blast Killed At Least Ten

TONAWANDA, N. Y. (AP)—The district attorney ordered an investigation opened today into a series of explosions that killed at least 10 workmen, injured 27 persons and blew a peroxide plant into rubble.

Fearing the death toll from yesterday's blasts might run as high as 12, searchers today probed the ruins of the one-story brick building for more bodies. Ten were reported yesterday, but it was not known if all were dead.

A fire chief said the explosions, thought to have been in chemical storage tanks at the Lucidol division plant of the Novadel-Agenc Corp., caused damage that would run into millions of dollars.

Dr. Francis Vissar's Hoof, president of the firm, said "Apparently in some unexplained manner a batch of material ignited and the explosion followed." But the company said the precise cause was not determined.

Stone's Widow Gets Everything

LOS ANGELES (AP)—The estate of actor Lewis Stone, in its entirety, goes to his widow, Mrs. Hazel Elizabeth Stone.

Stone's will, filed for probate yesterday and dated Feb. 18, 1935, explained that Stone was leaving nothing to his two daughters, Mrs. Virginia Stone Van Beuren of New York City and Mrs. Barbara Stone Ion of North Hollywood, because they were provided for under insurance policies.

Stone died Sept. 12 of a heart attack at the age of 73. He collapsed while chasing three teenage prowlers outside his home.

The actor's estate is valued at approximately \$150,000.
