Ex-Dorris Boy Has Funeral

DORRIS — Final rites have been held for Herbert W. Geller, 21, valedictorian of his Buile Valley High School graduating class in 1950 and a senior at Northwest Nazarene College, Nampa, Ida., who was killed instantly in an automobile accident Sept. 10 near Pendleton, Ore. At the time of the accident he was on his way to attend a funeral at Richfield, Wash., and it was thought the steering mechanism of his car locked as he attempted to pass a truck.

Herbert was the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Geller, former Dorris residents. His father was a former pastor of the Dorris Nazarene Church. Herbert was a member of the College Church of the Nazarenes and was studying to be a medical missionary. He was engaged to be married to Marjorie Graves of Kennewick, Wash., student nurse at Deaconess Hospital at Spokane.

Attending the Sept. 13 funeral from Dorris were his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. M. A. Hogau, and his uncle and aunt and their two children, Mr. and Mrs. Byard Kelly, Dickie and Walter, and Mrs. Earl Hitchcock.

Services were read by the Rev. Eugene Stover, pastor of the church, assisted by the college president, John E. Riley. Eulogy was given by Dick Ivester, student body president. Six fellow seniors acted as pall bearers and honorary bearers were members of the High School Sunday School class which he taught. Concluding services and interment were at Kohlerlawn Cemetery, Nampa.
