SEATTLE (AP) — The Universities of Washington and Illinois will meet in Seattle in 1955 in the first game of a new intercollegiate football series, UW Athletic Director Harvey Cassill announced Sunday. The Illini will come west Oct. 6, one week after the Huskies play Minnesota, Cassill said.

Freshmen Turn Out

EUGENE (AP) — Oregon freshmen turned out Monday for their curtailed football training season.

This will mark the seventh meeting this season between Big Ten and Pacific Coast Conference teams. The Midwesterners held a 4-2 margin.

Illinois turned back Stanford Saturday, 33-21. Ohio State's rugged outfit came out to Berkeley and powered California into defeat, 33-19. Iowa smeared Washington State, 54-12. And a week ago Michigan blasted Washington 50-0.

Southern California has been the Coast's salvation. It thumped Minnesota, 17-7, and Indiana, 27-14. UCLA's Bruins have the class to edge Wisconsin, provided tailback Paul Cameron comes up hale and hearty. Wisconsin's big punch is fullback Alan Ameche.

While UCLA, the conference favorite to get to the Rose Bowl, was disposing of Oregon 12-0 last week, Wisconsin eked out a win over stubborn Marquette.

In conference battles, Southern California travels to Seattle to oppose Washington; Stanford visits Portland for a crack at Oregon State and Oregon goes to Pullman to test Washington State.

Stanford, back from a hard luck 33-21 loss to Illinois rates over Oregon State, held scoreless in its three losses.

The Oregon-Washington State encounter shapes up as a close one. Oregon couldn't score against

UCLA Saturday or against Stanford the week before. WSC at least counted two touchdowns in its staggering loss to Iowa.

Idaho, winner over Montana, 20-12, goes up against Brigham Young. If comparative scores mean anything, San Jose State

clouted Idaho 24-6 but barely needed out Brigham Young, 28-20. California travels east for a meeting with a long time rival, Pennsylvania. The Bears couldn't handle Ohio State but may have a better chance with Penn, 15-7 winner over Penn State.
