Assuring Russia That Germany Won't Become Aggressive Might Be Tried

 WASHINGTON (U-P) - Proposals for giving Russia guarantees against possible new German aggression are most likely to come to a head in concluding plans to arm Western Germany.

No one here knows whether such assurances would make German arming in the Western alliance any more acceptable to Russia. Many diplomats doubt that it would.

Nevertheless, since the Western Powers now seem determined to go ahead with the German project, and since Russia is bitterly opposed, many feel the idea of a nonaggression guarantee is at least worth a try.

Another circumstance under which Russia could very likely get Western assurances of Germany's future peaceful behavior would be in the event a German unification plan and peace treaty were concluded. In fact, some officials advocate offering a nonaggression guarantee only as part of a package deal with Russia on Germany.

Secretary of State Dulles told a news conference yesterday that "the general problem of giving re-

assurance against the possible resurgence of German aggression is a matter which is being studied" by the United States in consultation with the British, French and West German governments.

Dulles said this government is urgently trying to find new ways to remove points of friction with the Soviet government in this hydrogen bomb age.

But Dulles emphasized that as anxious as the United States is to find ways of living with Russia, it is not interested in making meaningless agreements and is not considering any kind of nonaggression assurance other than one concerned with Germany—with guarantees regarding Korea and Austria as future possibilities if the Kremlin shows any interest.

Dulles thus undertook to deflate talk of some general nonaggression pact or system about which there has been speculation here and abroad in recent weeks.

He said Russia and the United States and its allies are members of the United Nations and that the U. N. Charter, with its renunciation of the use of force, makes the best possible nonaggression treaty.

But, Dulles added, the defeated World War II power, Germany is not a member of the United Nations and so it was thought that some means might be found to cover Germany by guarantees similar to those of the U. N. Charter. He said there has been no conclusions on the means.

The situation which gives point to the international talks on this problem is this: After months of delay, France is expected to ratify by early next year a treaty establishing a six-nation European Defense Community (EDC). West Germany, which is not a member of the North Atlantic Alliance, would be a member of EDC and would be rearmed. EDC would be tightly linked with the North Atlantic Alliance.

Russia is confronted with the prospect of seeing West Germany return to military strength as part of an anti-Communist alliance committed to the defense of Western Europe.

To the extent that the Kremlin actually fears a revival of military power in Germany, some kind of treaty guarantees against the use of that power for a new aggression in future years might have an appeal to the Soviets.

Dulles said both the Russian people and the French people were entitled to reassurance of this kind and that the German people wanted to give it. He thus suggested

Pair To Die For Slaying

LOS ANGELES (U-P) - Emmett Perkins and Jack Santo Tuesday were sentenced to death for the brutal murder of Mrs. Mabel Monahan, but Judge Charles Fricke postponed sentencing of Mrs. Barbara Graham until Oct. 13.

The three were convicted Sept. 22 of the March 9 killing of the wealthy crippled widow in her Burbank home. The jury made no recommendation of clemency so death sentence was mandatory.

Morse Redefines McKay's Term 'Local Interests'

WILTON JUNCTION, Iowa (U-P) - Sen. Morse (Ind-Ore) Tuesday described a public power policy statement by Secretary of the Interior McKay as a "masterpiece of private utility propaganda."

McKay's statement, Morse said in a speech prepared for the Eastern Iowa Light and Power Cooperative, placed great emphasis on giving a bigger part to "local interests" in power development.

"This has an appealing, neighborly, democratic sound," said Morse. "But who are the 'local interests' to be consulted?"

"Is it our REA (Rural Electrification Administration) cooperatives? Is it our public utility districts or people's utility districts?"

"No, the local interest for which the Eisenhower-McKay administration stepped aside on Hells Canyon Dam site is a Maine corporation."

Morse said this firm, the Idaho Power Corp., could not produce half the power made possible by Hells Canyon even if it builds three small dams in that area, the Columbia River Basin of the Northwest. The Democratic Truman administration had favored federal development of the site.

"The McKay August statement," said Morse, "gives a cozy picture of the federal government and local 'interests' living happily ever after in a firm partnership."

"Of course, partnerships are wonderful things—unless one of the partners happens to be picking your pockets."

With respect to the Idaho Power Co., he said: "Its ten largest stockholders are powerful investment houses and affiliates. These are not 'home folks.' They are the symbols of big business."

Parole Board Head Picked

WASHINGTON (U-P) - Atty. Gen. Brownell Wednesday announced the appointment of Dr. Paul Tappan, lawyer-sociologist formerly associated with the Universities of Wisconsin, Miami and New York, as the new chairman of the enlarged U.S. Parole Board.

At the same time, Brownell designated George Reed, formerly with the Minnesota Youth Conservation Commission, as chairman of the Parole Board's newly created youth division, which will have special supervision over young offenders.

Brownell said Mrs. Dorothy Lee, Republican former mayor of Portland, Ore., while regularly serving with the adult division of the board, will sometimes serve as a member of the youth division whenever the board chairman deems the services of an additional member to be necessary.
