Recipe

PINEAPPLE SLAW

Ingredients: 4 cups finely shredded green cabbage, one 8-ounce can pineapple chunks or slices cut up, 2 tablespoons of mayonnaise, 1 teaspoon cider vinegar, 1 teaspoon prepared yellow mustard, salt, lettuce.

Put cabbage in large mixing bowl. Drain pineapple and add. Mix $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoons of pineapple juice with the mayonnaise, vinegar and mustard. (Use remaining pineapple juice in a fruit drink if desired). Add to cabbage and pineapple with salt to taste; mix well. Chill at least $\frac{1}{2}$ hour, stirring a few times, so flavors will mingle. Serve on lettuce. Makes 4 servings.



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Mrs. Isabell (Mom) Foster, 629 Jefferson, has kindly offered to share her standard recipe for vegetable soup with Herald and News readers.

She is canning her own vegetable base now for use with soup stock or broth during the winter months. Vegetables are plentiful and reasonably priced on the market at this time of year. This fresh vegetable addition to winter soup can be as near at hand as your cupboard, and during the time of year when most of the fresh vegetables are out of season.

Mrs. Foster gives the following proportions but adds that personal taste can be used:

1 peck ripe tomatoes, run through colander or chopped
6 medium onions
1 bunch celery
1 red pepper
3 green peppers
Put onions, celery and pepper, through the food chopper.
Cook all vegetables until tender, adding 1 cup sugar and $\frac{1}{4}$ cup salt.
Melt $\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter or margarine, add enough flour to make thickening, add to vegetable and boil 20 minutes. Put in jars and seal.

Make coconut macaroons the 1/2 way: Combine $\frac{1}{2}$ cups shredded coconut, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup condensed milk, dash of salt, 1 teaspoon vanilla and $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon almond extract. Mix well and drop from teaspoon onto greased baking sheet, pressing down ends of the mixture with spoon. Bake in the for 15 minutes at 350 degrees.

Girl Scout Membership Reaches Two Million

The following editorial appeared in the October issue of The Girl Scout Leader, over the signature of Olivia Layton, president.

The girl whose registration brought our current national membership to two million has joined our ranks and has been warmly welcomed. Of course, she was not singled out like the two-millionth visitor at an amusement park to

be given the whirlwind celebrity treatment or made Queen for a Day in the best tradition of some radio programs. For this two-millionth member might have been anyone from any state or territory—from any part of the country. She knows that she is a symbol of all the girls who are, or want to be, Girl Scouts.

As a symbol, she reminds us of

the long waiting lists of girls in communities in all parts of our nation. But we do not think of those waiting lists in terms of chalk-ing up more members like numbers on an adding machine. Every girl in a new troop or the symbolic two-millionth member, is important. Every girl is entitled to the best that we can give her—a

troop and the backing of a responsible group of adults in her community.

We found, when we checked our records and read the name of the two-millionth member, that she was an Intermediate Girl Scout in Chillicothe, Ohio. So, by a happy circumstance, this Girl Scout symbolizes more than the mere fact of our growth. Chillicothe is in the heart of the new atomic energy development in Ohio, in which many
