

'Dragnet's' Opener Most Famous Notes In America

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Dumm da dum dumm.
The opening theme of "Dragnet," the cops-and-robbers TV show on NBC Thursday, has become the most famous four notes in America today. They have eclipsed "Zi da da dumm" — the start of Beethoven's Fifth Symphony that was the victory symbol in World War II.

British Troops Land In Colony

GEORGETOWN, British Guiana (AP) — British troops landed Thursday and mounted guard at government headquarters here and sugar estates outside the capital of this South American colony.

Small groups of persons watched the Royal Welsh Fusiliers disembark from the frigates Burghhead Bay and Bigbury Bay, which sailed into Georgetown Harbor before dawn.

The situation remained calm in the face of what leftist Prime Minister Cheddi Jagan called a "show of force." He is head of the majority People's Progressive Party (PPP), which has been accused by the British of Communist intrigues against the colonial government.

The Royal Welsh Fusiliers came from the West Indies island of Jamaica aboard the 8,000-ton cruiser Superb and the two 1,600-ton frigates. The frigates brought the men to dockside. About 120 men of the fusiliers were also reported en route to Georgetown from Jamaica on five chartered airliners.

The troops marched off to Government House and to the sugar estates, where labor troubles have occurred. The sugar crop is one of the colony's chief sources of revenue.

Jagan accused Sir Alfred Savage, governor of the colony, of calling for the troops without consulting his elected ministers. "The responsibility for whatever may happen is entirely that of the governor and those who have advised him," the fiery leader of the People's Progressive Party (PPP) told the colony's House of Assembly yesterday.

The PPP, which holds 18 of the Assembly's 24 seats, is demanding greater self-government and a trimming of the governor's powers. British authorities have accused party leaders of "Communist intrigues" and have warned that attempts might be made to set up a Communist state.

The government took extra precautions against disorders last night as authorities vetted the reported troop disembarkation behind a tight curtain of secrecy. Police and military headquarters were floodlighted and armed police guards were placed at the homes of officials and prominent citizens.

Britain has charged that the Communist movement in the colony is run by Jagan's U. S.-born wife, the former Janet Rosenberg. She is executive secretary of the PPP.

In Gary, Ind., however, Mrs. Jagan's brother declared the "British are trying to pin the Communist label on her because she has been fighting for the underdog."

James Rosenberg, an engineer for a chemical company, said his sister had been "appalled by the oppression of the sugar workers in the colony and set up a dental clinic to aid them. Later she helped organize them into a labor movement and finally into a political movement."
