**U. S. Firm:
 No Neutrals**
 WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States and its 16 Korean War partners stood firm today in a decision to bar neutral nations from the proposed Korean peace conference.
 A formal message on behalf of the United Nations side, sent to Communist China and North Korea, offered to send an American representative to Panmunjom Oct. 26 to discuss the peace parley with Reg officials.
 The note stressed, however, that the U. N. representative would be prepared to discuss only "a time and place" for the peace conference along with "procedural, administrative, and related questions as to arrangements."
 The new Communist demand that the membership of the projected peace parley also be thrashed out anew at Panmunjom was rejected by the U. N. Allies.

John Wayne's One Top Star Who's Not Afraid Of T-V

HOLLYWOOD—Chalk up John Wayne as one top film star who isn't afraid of television.
 The straggled actor from Winterset, Iowa, gave his versions of the new medium before his scheduled appearance on Jimmy Durante's TV show last night.
 "I accepted the role because I think Durante is the most lovable figure in the entertainment world today and it's a pleasure to be associated with him," he explained.
 Also, he admitted that TV is a good medium for selling theater movies.
 "It's bound to be a good advertising medium—look how fast the advertising agencies latched onto it," he reasoned. "There's no reason you can't sell pictures with it, as well as any other kind of product."
 "No, I wouldn't even mind doing a weekly show if I could find something that would be good. I see no reason why it would hurt me at the box office; it ought to be a big help. The only trouble is the work involved. It's just as hard to do a 25-minute film for TV and make it good, as it is to make a good hour-and-a-half movie for theaters."
 Wayne foresees the time when TV and movies will be wedded, anyway.
 "Some form of pay-as-you-see TV has got to come," he remarked. "Movies used to be the poor man's pleasure. He used to go out to a movie at 7 and be home at 9:30."
 "Now he has to go get the sifter and it's about 8 o'clock before he gets to the theater. Because of the double feature, there's little turnover and no place to park. He has to pay for parking. He has to buy popcorn and pop between pictures. The show is so long that his wife is hungry afterwards, and he has to buy a snack. By the time he gets home and returns the sifter, he has not only spent all that money but also lost a good night's sleep."
