Idaho Power Charged With Breaking FPC Regulations

WASHINGTON (AP) - A public power attorney said Tuesday Idaho Power Co. has violated Federal Power Commission rules which require the reporting of construction costs for completed power projects. The assertion was made by Mrs. Evelyn Cooper, who also has declared the company's application to build three along the Idaho-Oregon border contains insufficient information to conform to FPC rules.

Mrs. Cooper represents groups favoring construction of a federal dam in Hells Canyon near one of Idaho Power's proposed sites. She said at commission hearing on Idaho Power's applications that the company has not filed construction cost reports for the Bliss and Strike dams, also in the Snake River, although Bliss was several years old and Strike was completed early last year.

This has made it necessary, she said, to seek from Idaho Power witnesses information which should be on file with the FPC. She asked Idaho Power for detailed cost estimates for the Bliss and Strike plants for comparison with the three proposed projects.

R. P. Parry, Idaho Power attorney, said he would check with the company office at Boise to see if such data could be obtained readily.
