

Iron Curtain Not Rigid... It's Like Self-Sealing Tire

Editor's Note—Last month three student editors, granted visas by Moscow, flew off for a two-week tour of the Soviet Union. They took around Moscow and Kiev, and what they saw, as related by one of the group, 22-year-old Zander Hollander of the University of Michigan.

NEW YORK (AP)—An American in Russia feels like he's in another world.

In the two weeks I spent there, I was never allowed to forget the Iron Curtain.

We toured Moscow's busy, wide streets frequently. Leaving the Hotel National, I noticed the towering MVD millitiamen stationed around the clock at the door. We were not followed in our rubber-necking tours but, curiously, MVD men showed up often. They wore long, heavy blue overcoats, wore long epaulettes, and pistols were visible on their hips.

Once, at a state-owned market on Gorki street, I took a picture of a crowd of Muscovites elbowing their way to a chance to buy scarce Ukrainian melons. Seconds later, and MVD man showed up, asked to see our passports, and we couldn't take pictures. We argued that the tourist bureau had given us permission. He finally checked and came back to apologize. The crowd seemed to marvel that we got away with it.

From what I could see, Muscovites spend many non-working hours waiting in line. Just for the experience, I queued up with them for bread-shaped like bagels—these, which was tasty, and candy, which was very rubbery. For each of the three items, I had to line up three times.

First, you line up to find out what you're selling and for how much. Then you line up to get a purchase ticket from the cashier. That's when you pay. Then you get in a third line to get what you just paid for.

New Orleans' Split Twins Go Home Today

NEW ORLEANS (AP)—The Mouton twins—now normal, happy baby girls after their historic separation—will leave the hospital for their home in Lafayette today.

Catherine Anne and Carolyn Anne, daughters of Mayor and Mrs. Ashton Mouton of Lafayette, are leaving here much sooner than physicians expected.

"But they have improved so rapidly, so much better than expected," explained Dr. L. L. Weissmiller, director of Ochsner Foundation Hospital. "They are completely out of danger now."

Dr. Weissmiller said the girls were completely normal and happy in every respect. They play with toys, enjoy being fondled by their nurses and have very sunny dispositions.

The girls were joined near the base of the spine at birth July 22. They shared a common lower intestinal tract while the sacrum, a part of the lower vertebrae, was fused. They also were connected in the dural sac, the covering of the spinal cord at the lower end.

A team of eight surgeons separated them Sept. 17. One staff surgeon said the survival of both girls was a new page in medical history. To his knowledge, both twins had never survived such an operation.

Evidence of their good health was seen in their rapid gain in weight. At birth, together they weighed 11 pounds 8 ounces. Catherine Anne now weighs 9 pounds and Carolyn Anne weighs 8 pounds 12 1/2 ounces.

They will be brought back here periodically for checkups. More surgery on the intestinal tract, is necessary to complete the operation, but Dr. Weissmiller said that is several months away.

Butte Valley Farmers Worry About Weather

O'Brien Snarled In Argentina's Red Tape

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP)—Michael Patrick O'Brien, who has been shuttling about the world looking for a country that would receive him, arrived here Tuesday. Red tape apparently still kept him from a promised haven in the Dominican Republic.

O'Brien arrived aboard the French liner Bretagne from Montevideo, Uruguay, and was promptly locked in his cabin. He was not only kept from landing with the other passengers but also was prevented from seeing reporters and photographers.

The highly publicized wanderer, whose last known occupation was as a bartender in the Orient before the Communists took over China, said Monday in Montevideo the Dominican Republic had opened its doors to him. Dominican officials in New York confirmed his statement. But the Dominican embassy here said it had received no instructions to grant O'Brien entry to the republic.

Argentine immigration officials examined O'Brien's papers but made no move to permit him to land so he could take another ship for a Dominican port.

O'Brien escaped from China with Red Cross papers. He shuttled by ferry between British Hong Kong

and Portuguese Macao in the China Sea for 10 months without getting permission to land at either port. The Brazilian consul in Hong Kong gave him a visa for Brazil in July, but when he arrived at Rio de Janeiro via Europe, the Brazilian authorities had changed their

minds. Authoritative Brazilian sources said the refusal was based on printed reports, denied by O'Brien, that he had been involved in drug smuggling.

U. S. officials say his name is Ragan and he was deported. He lived in Oregon and Washington for several years.
