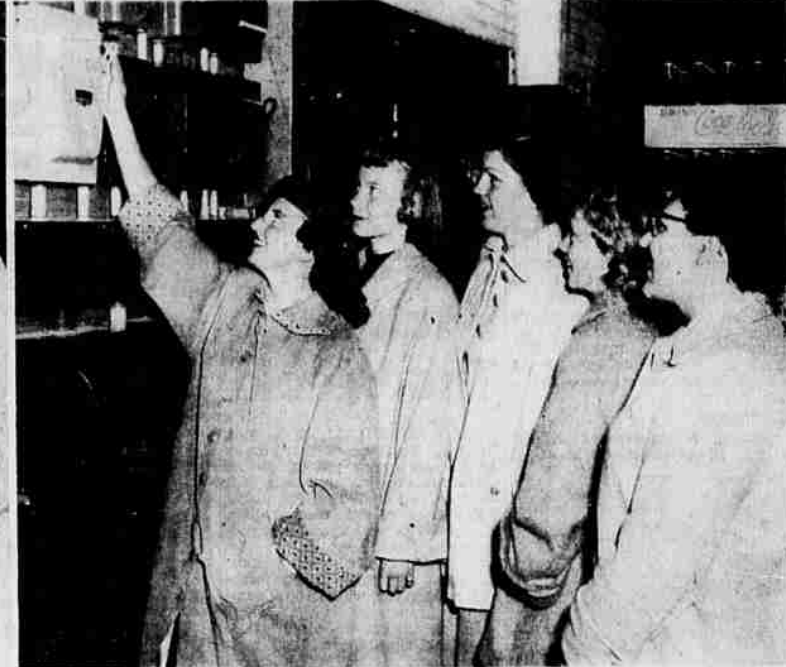

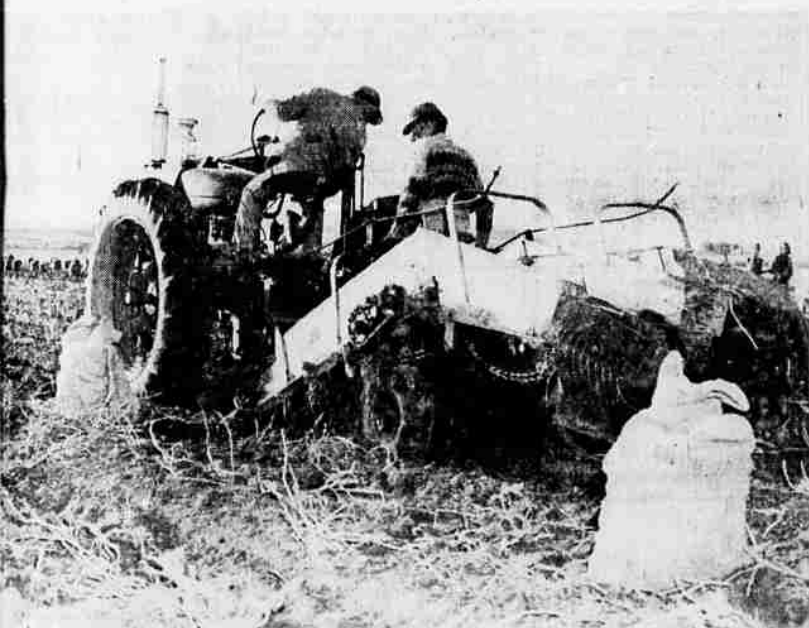

Plane's Sound Breaks Glass

PALMDALE, Calif. (AP) — The airport's plate glass windows, as well as the sonic barrier, were shattered during the first public demonstration of the Air Force F100 Super Sabre fighter plane. The successor to the F86 Sabre jet, which won fame in Korea, traveled more than 12 miles a minute Tuesday before an audience of nearly 100 persons. Test pilot George Welch boomed through the atmosphere, and the sound barrier, at a speed exceeding 720 miles per hour in North American Aviation's new swept-wing jet.

Pressure waves reverberated with explosive force as Welch pulled out of his supersonic dives. A wooden upright, 4x4 inches, was cracked and six big plate glass windows flew apart in the airport administration building. Twenty-seven smaller windows also were broken, but a North American spokesman said no one was injured. In this community, four miles from the airport, the sonic explosions rattled dishes as Welch put the Super Sabre through four power dives from 15,000 feet to 1,000 feet, where he pulled out to streak across the field about 100 feet above ground. His top speed was not announced.

Weather East Still Mild

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS. October's long spell of mild weather continued Wednesday over wide areas in the Eastern half of the nation. Cool weather, with rain and snow, was reported in many sections of the West. Another day of temperatures in

the high 70s and 80s appeared in prospect for the Indian Summer belt. Record readings for the date and for October were reported in scores of cities Tuesday from Minnesota to New York. Top readings included 86 at Chicago and St. Louis. New England was the coolest area in the Eastern half.

Heavy thundershowers hit the Western Plains states with rainfall of one inch in parts of Nebraska. Rugged southern winds swept northward through the Eastern sections a fall of two inches on the ground carrying increased moisture from the gulf. The wet belt extended westward across the central and northern Rockies. Snow was reported in the higher elevations with a fall of two inches on the ground at Mullen Pass in Northern Idaho.

Bayceon Population Reduced to Four

TILLAMOOK (AP) — The Bayceon population now is four. Mr. and Mrs. F. D. Mitchell were forced to leave that ocean-surrounded former resort Monday. Mrs. Mitchell, about 80, suffered stroke last Sunday.
