

Navyman Tells Guardsmen Off

SAN DIEGO, Calif. (AP)—A career Navy man told the U. S. National Guard Assn. Wednesday it should go slow in demanding greater advantages in pay and benefits than those enjoyed by men in the regular components of the armed forces.

The advice came from Rear Adm. George C. Dyer, commandant of the 11th Naval District, in an address before 2,000 delegates attending the 70th annual conference of the association. He declared: "If one may receive nearly all the benefits of the regular service and at the same time purvey a vocation in civilian life—although somewhat interrupted—there can be no adequate inflow into the regular service of young Americans of the caliber necessary to properly handle billion dollar budgets in the days of peace, or tight three dimensional wars at the drop of the hat."

He added: "I do not say this critically. I have spoken frankly because conditions in my service have reached the state where frank speaking is a necessity."


Gen. Charles L. Bolte, Army vice chief of staff, told the association Tuesday that America's forces in Europe are in fine shape and ready for any emergency.

People Won't Let Amos 'n' Andy Retire

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—People just won't let Amos 'n' Andy quit. The veteran blackface comedians, who have stayed in the big time longer than any radio stars, were thinking of retiring last season. But they're back on the CBS network every Sunday as lusty as ever. I asked the two boys how come.

First of all, we'd better get them straight. Amos (also plays King fish) is Freeman Gosden, 54, genial father of three children, the spokesman for the comedy team. Andy is Charles Correll, 63, wry, friendly, father of five.

"Like a lot of old-timers in radio," Amos explained, "we sort of felt left out when TV came along. Everybody was talking about the new medium and overlooking radio. We never had any notions about dying with our boots on; we wanted to quit while we were still ahead. So we let it out that we were thinking of retiring."

Amos 'n' Andy fans poured forth a flood of letters, wires and phone calls. While in the East, Amos visited a friend in Asheville, N.C. Local residents heard about it and took a quarter-page ad in the Citizen urging: "Please don't quit radio, Amos."

"Things like that helped change our minds," said Amos. "Also there was the urging of William Paley, head of CBS, and Justin Dart, our sponsor. We were impressed by the fact that there are more radios now than ever before. And there are many areas that the sponsor can't reach by TV."

"There was one other thing too. The show was our baby. We didn't feel like handing the baby over to someone else."

I asked the boys why they didn't play in the TV version of Amos 'n' Andy.

"We don't look the parts," volunteered Andy. "We found out when we did pictures years ago. I'm supposed to be the big fat one. So they had to pad me up, front and back, and they made me wear lifts on my shoes. They could never show a longshot of us walking together. Since Freeman is taller than I am, I had to walk on some boards beside him."
