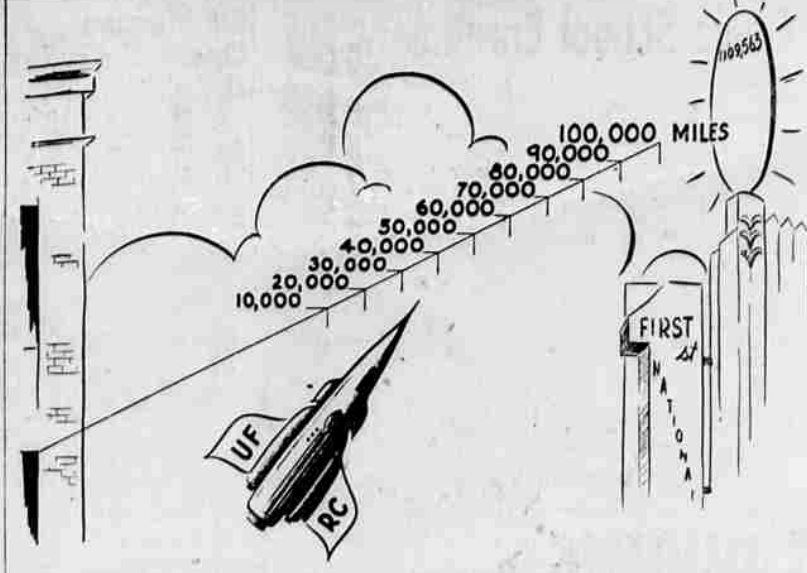

Dawn Starr Pleads Guilty

After spending 77 days in the County Jail awaiting her "day in court," the dancer decided not to fight the case and entered the guilty plea.

Before the plea was received, Judge David R. Vandenberg said that the way the indictment was drawn, he would have to consider the charge against Miss Starr as writing a check with insufficient funds instead of obtaining money under false pretenses, a more serious offense.
