

Reclamation Bureau Shakeup Would Shift Work To Denver

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Interior Department Wednesday announced a reorganization of the Reclamation Bureau designed to shift responsibility for basic technical work to Denver and make it the bureau's main working center.

The reorganization would shift district offices which are presently located in various parts of the country to Denver.

Lost Wheelbarrow Mine's Inventor Gets Three Years

GREAT FALLS, Mont. (AP) — Federal Judge Charles N. Pray Tuesday sentenced Lloyd J. Moore, 60, to three years in prison and fined him \$2,000 in connection with the sale of stock in the Lost Wheelbarrow gold mine near Pottsville, Pa.

The sentence and fine were on a charge of fraud under the Federal Securities Act. Judge Pray said Moore had sold 10 shares of stock in the mine to a group of investors in 1949, resulting from a "misunderstanding."

Moore's troubles started in 1935 when he and a companion reported they had found the legendary Lost Wheelbarrow mine. According to the legend, two men who first discovered the mine brought back a sack of gold dust.

Later the two quarreled and one shot the other and left his body beside a wheelbarrow at the mine.

In 1935, Moore said he and a partner had found the body.

The report, he said later, led to demands from people who "wanted to buy into the mining discovery," and stock was sold to some 1,200 persons in Idaho, Washington, Montana, Oregon and Canada.

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all of which will be retained, may be altered due to changes in operating procedures.

In retaining the regional organization framework, the department said Region 2 will be re-established at Sacramento, Calif. The old regional office there was abolished June 30 and replaced on July 1, by a California projects office. A proposal to combine Regions 6 and 7, with headquarters at Billings, Mont., and Denver, was rejected.

The reorganization is based on studies by a survey team named by Secretary of the Interior McKay to recommend steps for "greater streamlining, coordination and efficiency of the bureau."

The basic responsibility of the bureau is to provide irrigation in the 17 Western states. It also is now engaged in construction of a hydroelectric plant in Alaska.

In a statement announcing approval, with some modification, of the survey team's recommendations, McKay said:

"The recommendations and their implementation are largely directed to de-centralization of Bureau of Reclamation planning, construction and operation activities to the greatest degree possible in order to permit closer cooperation with the water users."

"The commissioner's office in Washington will be concerned hereafter largely with policy, administration, liaison with the Congress and other governmental agencies and such essential services as may be related to the subject."

"Technical phases of operation and maintenance, project planning and design and construction will be centered in the Denver office of the bureau. Denver has long been the center of reclamation engineering operations and is in the heart of the area served by the bureau."

The new set-up provides for three assistant commissioners, with one to be Chief Engineer L. N. McClellan at Denver. As chief engineer McClellan has headed the branch of design and construction in Denver. As assistant commissioner and chief engineer, he will be in charge of all staff activities here.

The other two assistant commissioners will be located here. Harvey F. McPhail, a veteran bureau engineer, will be in charge of the division of operations. Dexheimer said he was not ready to announce who will be assistant commissioner in charge of administration.

Several weeks ago the job of one of the three assistant commissioners here, who had been in charge of design and construction, was abolished. At that time Asst. Commissioner Goodrich W. Line-weaver was demoted to be an assistant to the commissioner and McPhail was retained as an assistant commissioner.

The survey team was headed by E. A. Moritz of Boulder City, Nev., who retired last year as Pacific southwest regional director of the bureau.

PORTLAND (AP) — Chancellor Charles D. Byrne told the State Board of Higher Education Tuesday that the U. S. Public Health Service is moving its toxicity and fisheries unit to the Oregon State College campus.

The service has been looking for some time for a West Coast site for the unit which now is located at Cincinnati, he said.

In other action Tuesday, that board said it would appeal a circuit court decision which would make the State Dental School an autonomous institution under the board.

Judge Downs 6 3.2 Beers, For Justice

DENVER (AP) — After imbibing six bottles of 3.2 beer Tuesday night, Judge Duncan Cameron of Denver traffic court declared: "If I'm not drunk I'd like to know what you call it."

His activities were part of a carefully controlled experiment in which Cameron had his blood-alcohol count checked at Denver general hospital.

The personal experiment was the latest incident in a controversy which has raged since August, when the State Supreme Court ruled 3.2 beer is not intoxicating. Colorado law permits the sale of 3.2 beer to persons 18 to 21 years old.

Cameron, accompanied by two morals bureau detectives, drank two bottles of the 3.2 beer at intervals between 8 p.m. and midnight. After each "course" his blood was tested.

After the final check, he went home to bed.

Legislation Draft Meet Set

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower and Sen. Knowland (R-Calif.) Wednesday drafted plans for a late November or early December meeting with Republican congressional leaders on the administration's new legislative program.

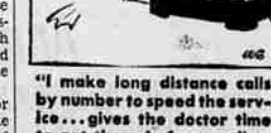
Knowland, the Senate Republican leader, told reporters: "We are going to continue the cooperation, the teamwork, between the administration and Congress."

He said there will be full consultation with Republican leaders of Senate and House in advance of the submission of a legislative program to the next session of Congress in January.

Later on, he said, Democratic leaders will be consulted on some specific questions as well as chairmen of interested congressional committees.

At his breakfast conference with the President Wednesday morning, Knowland said, there was no discussion of specific issues.

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
