Reds Reject Dean's Plan

PANMUNJOM (AP) — Communist diplomats today called an American proposal for setting up a peace conference "absurd... a trick... absolutely unacceptable" and pushed preliminary talks deeper into deadlock.

Although the Red refusal was no surprise, they made clear their answer was no to S. Ambassador Arthur Dean's plan to fix a time and place for the conference now and talk about composition later.

Confused by the Red rejection, Dean agreed to a Communist request that he think over their plan. The meeting recessed until tomorrow.

The Communists insisted that composition of the conference be decided before anything else. They proposed that five non-aligned nations—Russia, India, Burma, Pakistan, and Thailand—sit in on the conference.

The Allies have stood firm so far by their plan that the conference include only the nations which have fought in Korea, plus Russia if the Chinese and North Koreans invite her.

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Democrats Fight for Life In Sen. Byrd's Virginia

RICHMOND, Va. (AP)—The Virginia Democratic organization of Sen. Harry F. Byrd, spurred by what it regards as the first serious Republican challenge in 24 years, is fighting to keep the governorship in the party.

The campaigning leading up to next Tuesday's general election is in blaring contrast to the apathy of most previous years, when everyone knew the governor had been selected when the Democratic nominee was picked. Democrats have ruled in Virginia since Reconstruction days.

But this time the Republicans have put up a proven voice getter, GOP National Committeeman Theodore Roosevelt Dalton, 52, whose pre-dominantly Democratic district keeps sending him back to the State Senate. The Republicans have written a platform that has drawn praise from some Democrats and have buckled down to a vote-hustling job unmatched since their latest big, though unsuccessful, effort in 1929.

The Democratic candidate blessed by the Byrd organization, is Thomas B. Stanley, a former congressman and a businessman whose main campaign plank calls for continuation of "sound fiscal policies."

Some Republicans concede their present big effort is a "now or never" attempt to make a lasting political realignment out of the 1952 Eisenhower sweep in Virginia—helped along by Byrd's refusal to support the national Democratic ticket.

North Koreans Will Listen

PANMUNJOM (AP) — Violently anti-Communist North Korean prisoners have agreed to attend Communist interviews tomorrow, ending a two-week holdout which threatened to wreck the Neutral Nations Repatriation Commission.

"They are coming out tomorrow for explanations — so they have agreed," said Lt. Gen. K. S. Thimayya, Indian chairman of the commission.

Five hundred North Koreans are scheduled to move out of their compounds at 8 a.m. (6 p.m. EST Friday) for interviews with Red explainers who will try to persuade them to return home. Another 500 are to be interviewed in the afternoon.

The Koreans' decision to attend the interviews peacefully represented a solid personal triumph for patient Gen. Thimayya.

He told newsmen that after days of delicate negotiations the POW leaders indicated two days ago they were willing to attend explanations. But they asked for time to talk fellow prisoners into attending.

The commission chairman said he was notified Thursday night that the men were ready to start Saturday morning.

The NNRC promptly notified the Communist and U. N. commands that explanations would be held for the first time since Oct. 15 at 8 a.m. Saturday.
