**Language Barrier Surmounted; Test Flunked Anyhow**

SHAWNEE, Okla. (AP)—Highway Patrol Examiner Fred Green and George Helms bumped head on into a linguistic road block when they attempted to test Michael Szaizko, a 49-year-old displaced Russian.

Szaizko doesn't speak English. His wife, a displaced German, speaks German and Russian but no English. Their daughter—Wanda, 6, could speak German and English but not Russian.

So Green and Helms first tried to give the test by talking to the girl, who told Mama, who told Papa. The answers came back the same route, except it all got too confusing.

So another displaced German, Jela Joelo, a mechanic here, was called in. He speaks German and English and passed on the questions to the wife who relayed them to Szaizko.

He promptly flunked the driving test.



**"AIRCRAFT FLASH - ONE MULTI-LOW-BO DELAY-PETER MAN 1 BLACK-NORTH 2 MILES GOING EAST"**


That's how the observer calls in an aircraft flash message. Let's see what happens to that message when it reaches the filter center in Portland.




**THE PLOTTER** sits at the filter board wearing a headset. When she says, "Air defense, go ahead please," she has in her hand...



**THE GRID SQUARE** on the board where the post is located. She places the pip at the distance from the post and pointing in the direction reported by the observer. The pip remains there until a second report comes on the aircraft. Then...




**THE RADAR STATION** relays the information on the new track. The radar center coordinates this information with their own reports. If the aircraft remains unidentified, they scramble.



**JET INTERCEPTORS** to make contact with the aircraft and identify it. If it cannot be identified as friendly, the jet pilots have orders to shoot it down.

**PORTLAND AIR DEFENSE FILTER CENTER OPERATIONS ROOM**



**KEY TO FILTER CENTER PERSONNEL:**

- A - PLOTTERS receive and plot calls from observers at Ground Observer corps posts.
- B - FILTERERS convert plots into logical tracks by analyzing plotted information and call for raid stands.
- C - OVERLAP PLOTTER-TELLERS and relay information on aircraft going into alter center's territory into another.
- D - RUNNERS convey information from filterers to the raid clerk and radar tellers.
- E - RAID CLERK sets up raid stands and assigns track numbers as called for by filterers and overlap plotters.
- F - DAY DIRECTOR assists military in administrative and operative supervision of volunteers working during 24-hour period of responsibility.
- G - FLOOR SUPERVISOR assists team captain in supervision of floor personnel.
- H - RADAR TELLERS relay filtered information -- new tracks and movements of tracked aircraft -- to appropriate Air Defense Direction Center.
- J - RECORDERS maintain written record of information relayed by radar tellers to Air Defense Direction Centers.
- I - TELEPHONE MONITOR supervises all personnel using telephone equipment.
- L - TEAM CAPTAIN assists military and day director in supervision of volunteer personnel during six-hour team period.
- M - MILITARY SUPERVISOR is responsible for the overall operation of the filter center during period of responsibility.

**Corvallis Veto Agitates Wets**

CORVALLIS (AP)—Mayor Dean Dorsey vetoed the controversial liquor-by-the-drink ordinance here Thursday, and wet forces immediately began planning new tactics to get liquor into this traditionally dry college town.

It was the first veto exercised by a mayor in at least 20 years.

There were two prominently mentioned courses of action for the wets:

1. They can try to pass the ordinance over the mayor's veto. That would require support from two-thirds of the City Council's nine members. The chances are slim, since the important passage vote favoring liquor by the drink. That Monday night was 5-4.
2. They can pass a resolution could not be vetoed. It could be passed by a 5-4 vote, and it would express council policy as well as an ordinance would.

In the Monday action the council approved six applications for liquor-by-the-drink licenses. These have been held in Corvallis, pending action by the mayor. If a resolution for liquor is passed at the next council meeting, scheduled Nov. 16, the applications would go to the State Liquor Commission for final action.

There was some talk in the streets that the wets might ask the council majority also to pass
