India Wants To Live Own Life, Mrs. Pandit Says

NEW YORK (AP) — Mrs. Vijaya Lakshmi Pandit, president of the United Nations General Assembly, says India wants the right to remain neutral in the East-West conflict and live her own life.

India, she said, stands for the right to decide her own life and to determine her own relation to the rest of the world. "We may not suit you. It may suit some one else."

Bachelor, Korean Waif Land In US

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — A rugged 35-year-old Navy bachelor and the chubby little Korean waif he took off the streets of Inchon more than a year ago have finally made it to the United States.

After weeks of battling red tape, the pair—both of them smiling shyly—arrived yesterday aboard a big Mars flying boat from Honolulu.

Four-year-old Lee Kyung Soo was wearing a uniform just like that of Chief Boatswain's Mate Vincent T. Paladino of New Rochelle, N. Y., a veteran of 13 years in the Navy.

Head Of State Demos Tells Story Of 'Theft'

PORTLAND (AP) — Howard Morgan, Democratic state chairman, wants everyone in Oregon to know he is no tire thief.

So he displayed an affidavit here Wednesday, and told a story which, he said, his political opponents have been trying to distort for years.

His story: While still a student in 1936, he took a job working for Jack R. Eatch, a Portland general contractor, at a construction camp in Central Oregon. There a tire, which later turned out to be a stolen one, wound up in camp.

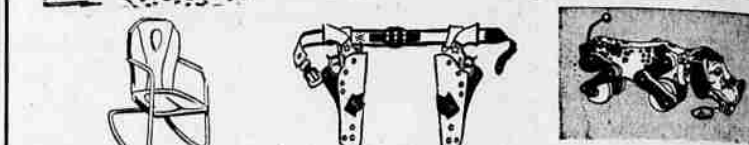
